



2016 PAC-12 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT

Post-Game Notes

GAME 4: #5 Washington (67), #12 Colorado (51)
Thursday, March 3, 2016

The Huskies move on to play #4 seed Stanford tomorrow at 8:30 p.m. PST. The Cardinal is 1-0 in Tournament play against Washington.

Washington is now 8-14 in Tournament play; Colorado is even at 5-5. This is the first time Colorado has lost its first game in a Tournament. Colorado won the only previous Tournament game between the teams (70-59).

The 5th seed in the Tournament has won 3 of 4 games against the #12 seed.

The teams played for the 2nd time in 5 days in Seattle, with Washington previously winning 68-47 on its campus.

Washington led the entire game. Colorado only trailed by 3 points (19-16) with 7:11 to go in the half. Washington outscored the Buffaloes 21-7 to close out the half.

For Washington:

The nation's 3rd leading scorer, Kelsey Plum scored 20+ points for the 27th time in 30 games (double figures scoring in all 30).

Plum moved into 7th place on the all-time Pac-12 career scoring list with 2253 points, passing her assistant coach, Adia Barnes (Arizona, 2237 pts.), and Tina Thompson (USC, 2248 pts). She needs 25 points to become the Huskies all-time career scoring leader.

Plum also moved into 4th place on the Pac-12 single-season scoring list with 795, passing Candice Wiggins (2008, 787 points.)

Talia Walton scored in double figures for the 8th straight game (season, 27) and added to her school record for career blocked shots with 4 (169 total). The 4 were a season high and tied for 4th most (tied) in a Tournament game.

Chantel Osahor's 18 rebounds were the 4th most (tied) in a Tournament game. It was her 17th double digit rebounding game of the season.

For Colorado:

All-Freshman Team selection Kennedy Leonard scored 20+ points for 4th time this season (3rd in a row) and in double figures for the 18th time this season.

Haley Smith's 11 rebounds were a season high (2nd time in double-digits).
