



## **2018 PAC-12 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT**

### **Post-Game Notes**

GAME 10: #2 Stanford (58), #6 Arizona State (46)  
Saturday, March 3, 2018

Stanford advances to the Tournament title game for the 15<sup>th</sup> time in 17 seasons (12-2 record in previous games) and will face #1 seeded Oregon at 6:00 p.m. PT, on ESPN2.

In their only meeting this season, Stanford won at Oregon (78-65) on 2/4. That was Oregon's only home loss of the season; the margin of loss was Oregon's highest (tie, Louisville). The Ducks' Lexi Bando missed the game with an injury.

Stanford is now 42-4 in Tournament games overall.

Tomorrow's game will be the 8<sup>th</sup> #1 vs. #2 seed matchup in Tournament history. Stanford has appeared in all 7 prior games (6-1).

Tonight's attendance of 6,889 is the second highest for a Tournament semifinal round (8,384 last season at KeyArena.)

Stanford's first 5 field goals were made by 5 different players (the starters) as the Cardinal took an early 13-3 lead. The Sun Devils made their first field goal attempt and missed their last 9 of the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter. ASU's 3 points were the fewest in any quarter this season.

Stanford was "plus 26" during the 32 minutes Alanna Smith was in the game.

Stanford held ASU to the Sun Devils' lowest point total in any half this season (18, 1<sup>st</sup> half). The previous low was 19 in the second half vs Oregon on 2/23).

ASU's .310 field goal percentage was its second lowest of the season (13-42), with the 13 made the fewest (18, twice).

The Cardinal's Kiana Williams led her team in scoring for the second straight Tournament game with 24 points (18 vs. USC). She set career bests for: field goals made (9), FG % (.818) and 3-point field goals made (6).

ASU's Charnea Johnson-Chapman had 3 blocks for the 2<sup>nd</sup> time in the Tournament (both were career highs.)
