



2018 PAC-12 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT

Post-Game Notes

GAME 9: #1 Oregon (65), #4 UCLA (62)

Saturday, March 3, 2018

Oregon will be making its first Tournament final appearance. It carries an 8-game winning streak into the title contest. The Ducks last loss was 2/4 vs. Stanford.

Oregon's Tournament record vs. UCLA is now 1-1 and 8-16 overall.

The #1 seed had won all 10 matchups with #4.

Freshman of the Year Satou Sabally was injured and left the game with 6:05 left in the 4th quarter (UCLA led 58-52). Oregon went on an 13-4 run after that to take a 65-62 lead (the final score). The Bruins last points were at 5:28 (10-0 run.) UCLA missed its last 7 shots.

UCLA's Jordin Canada scored 46 points in the Tournament after tallying 27 on Friday. She had 46 assists in her Tournament career, good for 2nd place (tie) on the all-time list.

The Ducks' Ruthy Hebard had her 2nd double-double of the Tournament (11th of the season); she also had one in last season's Tournament. Her 4 blocks equaled a career best (3rd time.)

UCLA is now 23-2 when leading after 3Q. (Lost at OSU after leading by 1)

Three Bruins scored in double figures: Canada, Billings and Burke.

Since conference play started, Oregon's largest deficit was 13 points, vs. Stanford on 12/29; UCLA led twice by 13 in the 2nd quarter. UCLA's largest lead against Oregon in the two regular season games was 4. Oregon is 1-4 this season when trailing by 10+ points at any time during the game. (The last time the Ducks overcame a double digit deficit was 1/13/17 at USC.)

The Ducks closed the 1st half on a 13-2 run, with 4 different players scoring led by Lexi Bando's 5. The run continued into the second half, reaching 18-2 as the Ducks retook the lead (37-34). The Bruins retook the lead at the end of the quarter with a 13-4 run.

Oregon committed only 7 personal fouls, its fewest of the season.

Oregon is now 5-4 when trailing after one quarter.
