THIS WEEK IN PAC-12 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

A light game week is on the schedule as teams also prepare for the end of the academic term. Only COLORADO, ARIZONA STATE and WASHINGTON STATE have a pair of games slated, and seven have a single game (all but one at home), while two others are off for the week ... For the fifth-consecutive week, a Pac-12 team occupies the top spot in the national polls. STANFORD took over No. 1 in both the *Associated Press* and *USA Today/WBCA Coaches* poll this week, its first No. 1 ranking in either poll since Nov. 17, 2014. OREGON slipped to No. 3 and OREGON STATE continues to impress, earning a No. 5 ranking by the coaches and writers. UCLA maintains its No. 11 rating while ARIZONA cracked the top 20, moving up several spots to No. 20 in the AP poll and tying for No. 19 in the coaches polling ... After facing three tough ranked opponents last week, the Cougars face another tough opponent this week as rival Gonzaga visits Pullman. It will be the 31st meeting between the teams ... UCLA's Japreece Dean was voted Pac-12 Player of the Week after recording her first-career triple-double becoming just the sixth Bruin to achieve the feat. Stanford freshman Haley Jones was tabbed the Pac-12 Freshman of the Week after leading the Cardinal to a win over then-No. 10 Mississippi State ... The Ducks' Sabrina Ionescu broke the Pac-12's all-time assists record last week, claiming the mark formerly held by WNBA standout and former Bruin Jordin Canada ... Oregon State head coach Scott Rueck picked up his 500th-career win last week. His career spans 24 seasons, 10 of which have been in Corvallis ... Since starting the season at 1-1, WASHINGTON has won five in a row to go 6-1, matching its best start since 1997-98 when the Huskies opened with 10-straight wins ... Only 18 teams are undefeated in the country as of Dec. 3, with five of them coming from the Pac-12, including Arizona, Colorado, OSU, Stanford and UCLA.

2020 PAC-12 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT

MANDALAY BAY EVENTS CENTER LAS VEGAS, NEV. THURSDAY-SUNDAY, MARCH 5-8

After a successful first year in Las Vegas, the 19th-annual Pac-12 Women's Basketball Tournament presented by New York Life returns, this season heading to the Mandalay Bay Events Center from March 5-8, 2020, and will continue to receive unprecedented television coverage as each game of the tournament is scheduled to be televised either on the Pac-12 Networks or ESPN2.

The tournament made its debut in 2002 and has been held annually since. The University of Oregon campus played host the first season. The Conference's premier women's sporting event then moved to HP Pavilion in San Jose for a six-year run (2003-08). It spent four years

(2008-2012) in Los Angeles, with Galen Center playing host. The final two-year run in L.A. saw it combined with the men's tournament and the semifinal and championship games were played at the STAPLES Center.

The tournament then moved to Seattle's Key Arena for a record-setting six years from 2013-2018 where attendance numbers grew each year, including the first-ever sold-out session.

The winner of the 12-team tournament receives the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship. The tournament seeds and Conference Champion are determined by the 18-game regular-season Pac-12 schedule.

CONFERENCE NOTEBOOK

IONESCU BREAKS ALL-TIME ASSISTS RECORD

Already having claiming several NCAA triple-doubles records, Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu also became the Pac-12's all-time assists leader on Nov. 28 vs. Oklahoma State, breaking the mark set by WNBA standout Jordin Canada (2015-18) dished out 831 in her career at UCLA. Both Canada and Ionescu are the only players in league history to dish 800 assists. Ionescu is looking to become the first with 2,000 points, 1,000 assists and 1,000 rebounds in NCAA history. When Canada broke the all-time mark in 2018, the record had stood for 27 years.

XXX

Aari McDonald's 44 points on Nov. 17 against then-No. 22 Texas broke the Arizona single-game scoring record but also tied for the 10th-highest scoring output in Pac-12 women's basketball history. Only three student-athletes have scored more since 2009 on four different occasions, including NCAA scoring record holder Kelsey Plum of Washington, who dropped a Pac-12 record 57 on Feb. 25, 2017 and 45 on Nov. 14, 2014. Already this season, three different student-athletes have scored at least 30 points in a game on four occasions.

2,000-POINT MILESTONE

Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu reached 2,000-career points in the Ducks' 109-52 win over Utah State. She is the fourth Duck ever to reach the threshold and the second since the Pac-12 began sponsoring women's sports in 1986-87. Other Pac-12 student-athletes within reach of 2,000-career points are fellow Duck Ruthy Hebard and Washington State's Borislava Hristova, who would become the first Cougar to achieve the milestone. There have now been 21 players in Pac-12 history to score 2,000 points.

PAC-12 LEADS WITH THE MOST NATIONAL POY CANDIDATES

The Pac-12 led the way on all three national player of the year watch lists, with as many as 11 earning a spot on at least one list. Nine from the Conference were selected preseason candidates for the Wade Trophy and John Wooden Award, including 2019 winner Sabrina Ionescu. Oregon had the most candidates with three. Oregon State and Stanford both had multiple candidates, and Arizona and UCLA each had a representative. On the Naismith Award watch list, the Pac-12 led the way with 11, with four Ducks being cited, the most of any team in the country. A Bruin was also added. The list of names on each of the watch lists are on page 4.

A Pac-12 student-athlete has won the Wade Trophy and Wooden Award in two of the last three years, with Washington's Kelsey Plum nabbing the honors in 2017. Sweeping the national player of the year honors that season, Plum is the only one from the Conference to claim the Naismith Award.

ESPN.COM TOP 25 PLAYERS OF 2019-20

Over one third of the student-athletes named to ESPN.com's Top 25 Players of 2019-20 are from the Pac-12. Altogether, nine from the Pac-12 were listed in the top 20, led by Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu. Oregon had three recognized in the top 10 and Oregon State's Destiny Slocum came in at No. 9. Spots Nos. 8-15 were all occupied by a Pac-12 student-athlete except one. Five different schools were also represented on the list.

NCAA ACTIVE LEADERS

The top three career scoring leaders among active NCAA women's basketball players, across all three divisions, are from the Pac-12. Wade Trophy and Wooden Award winner Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu leads all three divisions with 2,079 points, followed by teammate Ruthy Hebard (1,936) and Washington State's Borislava Hristova (1,831). Ionescu could become the first player in NCAA history to amass 2,000 points, 1,000 assists and 1,000 rebounds in a career. And lastly, Ionescu is, by far, the NCAA's career leader in triple-doubles with 19, setting that record last season.

Hebard the NCAA's active career on the rebounding list (1,068), also boasting the best career shooting percentage (.646), field goals made (796) and double-doubles (45). She is looking to become the first active player this season to eclipse the 2,000 points and 1,000 rebounds threshold.

IONESCU LOOKING TO BECOME THE FIRST

Wade Trophy and Wooden Award winner Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu could become the first player in NCAA history to amass 2,000 points, 1,000 assists and 1,000 rebounds in a career. The NCAA's active career scoring and assists leader, she has tallied 1,996 points, 798 assists and 764 rebounds. Ionescu has grabbed 793 rebounds over the last three seasons, grabbing a career-best 282 last year.

19 NAMED TO NATIONAL POSITIONAL AWARDS WATCH LISTS

A combined 19 from the Pac-12 were named to the Basketball Hall of Fame/WBCA Starting Five watch lists, which is the most for any conference. At least one Pac-12 student-athlete was on each of the lists. The Conference had the most candidates for any league for the Ann Meyers Drysdale (5), Cheryl Miller (5) and Nancy Lieberman Awards (4), and tied for the most for the Katrina McClain Award (3). Nine (out of 12) different league schools are represented across the five lists, tying with the ACC (out of 15) for the most school representation for a conference. Both Oregon and STANFORD lead Pac-12 teams with four candidates each, tying for second most in the country. ARIZONA, OREGON STATE and UCLA each had multiple nominees, as well, while USC, UTAH, WASHINGTON and WASHINGTON STATE each had a candidate on one of the lists. Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu is a two-time winner of the Liberman Award and teammate Ruthy Hebard was the 2018 winner of the McClain Award.

OREGON PICKED PRESEASON FAVORITES

Defending regular-season Pac-12 Champion OREGON was picked the preseason favorite to win the regular season by the media and coaches. The Ducks received all 11 possible first-place votes by the coaches then garnered 19 of 20 first-place votes from the media. The coaches and media polls were nearly identical. STANFORD was picked No. 2 in each of the pollings, receiving the only other first-place votes, and OREGON STATE was picked third.

DUCKS CLAIM HISTORIC WIN; PAC-12 TEAMS TAKE ON TEAM USA

On a collegiate tour tune-up as it prepares to the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, the USA Women's National Team made stops at Oregon, Stanford and Oregon State. The Ducks provided the most talked about result, becoming the first college team since 1999, and only the second ever, to defeat the Red, White and Blue. Led by Sabrina Ionescu's 30-point outing, the Ducks won by a 93-86 margin, holding off the best team in the world as they made a late push.

Team USA opened at Stanford where it led early on and trailed just 68-62 going into the final quarter before the national team took control for good and won, 95-80. Junior Kiana Williams knocked down five of the team's 10 threes, tying for the team scoring lead with 17 points. Oregon State fell to the Americans by a score of 81-58, losing the rebounding battle by just five (35-30). Redshirt junior Destiny Slocum led the way with 15 points and five assists.

All three teams are ranked in the top five of both national polls.

PRESEASON RANKINGS

For the fourth-straight year and just the fifth time ever, five Pac-12 teams are ranked in the preseason Associated Press poll with three of those teams ranking in the top 10 for the second-straight year. OREGON earned its first-ever No. 1 ranking, the first preseason No. 1 ranking for a Pac-12 team since 1996-97.

For the third time in four years, five Pac-12 teams are ranked in the USA Today/WBCA Coaches Poll with the Ducks earning the No. 1 ranking in the poll for the first time in program history, the Conference's first preseason No. 1 team since Stanford started the 1996-97 campaign at No. 1.

The three top-10 teams in both polls ties for the most of any conference in the country. In addition to Oregon, STANFORD was also ranked in the top three of both pollings, with OREGON STATE making an appearance in the top 10. ARIZONA STATE and UCLA are also ranked in the top 25. All five teams advanced to at least the NCAA Sweet Sixteen last season.

PRESEASON BRACKETOLOGY

ESPN's Charlie Creme's preseason bracketology has six Pac-12 teams in the NCAA Tournament. Creme has Oregon (Portland) and Stanford (Greenville) as No. 1 seeds, Oregon State as a No. 2 seed (Fort Wayne), UCLA as a No. 3 seed (Dallas), Arizona State as a No. 5 seed (Fort Wayne) and Arizona as a No. 8 seed (Dallas). If it holds, the No. 1 seeds would be the first for the Conference since 2013 and the first time since 1990 the Pac-12 would have two No. 1 seeds. The Wildcats will be looking for their first NCAA Tournament bid since 2005.

PAC-12 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL CONTINUES STRONG CAMPAIGNS

The Pac-12 is in the midst of its most successful run, coming off a fourth-straight season with at least six NCAA Tournament bids, receiving at least five every year since 2013-14. The Conference boasts the most NCAA Tournament wins (55) of any conference since 2015-16 and has the best winning percentage among peer league during that span (.696). Pac-12 teams combined for an 11-1 record through the first two rounds in last year's tournament for the best record for a conference since 1997, going undefeated in the opening round for the third time in four years. Oregon's run to the NCAA Women's Final Four marked the 10th time in 12 years a Pac-12 team had advanced that far with the Ducks becoming the fifth different team in the national semifinal since 2013. No other conference has sent as many different teams to the Final Four during that span. The Pac-12 is the only conference to have at least two teams in the Elite Eight the last four years, placing at least four in the Sweet 16 during that time. For the first time ever, five Pac-12 teams appeared in the final *Associated Press* poll, with two ranked in the top 10, extending the Conference's streak of two top-10 ranked teams to five-consecutive years. For the first time ever, five Pac-12 teams were in the top 15 of the final *USA Today/WBCA Coaches* poll, also marking the second time in three years five teams are in the final ranking. Additionally, it marked the first time three teams are ranked in the coaches' final top 10.

ALL-STAR RETURNS

The Conference's top talent returns with 10 of the 15 All-Pac-12 team members back, led by Wade Trophy and John R. Wooden Award winner Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu, former 2017 national freshman of the year Oregon State's Destiny Slocum and the nation's top-returning scorer in Arizona's Aari McDonald, who led the Wildcats to a WNIT title.

Also back are national positional award candidates DiJonai Carrington (Stanford), Ruthy Hebard (Oregon), Borislava Hristova (Washington State), Michaela Onyenwere (UCLA), Mikayla Pivec (Oregon State), Satou Sabally (Oregon) and Kiana Williams (Stanford). Hristova is looking to become the first 2,000-point scorer in WSU history and is a two-time All-Pac-12 honoree. Hebard was named All-Pac-12 three times, along with teammate Ionescu.

NEW FACES & FAMILIAR FACES

The Pac-12 welcomes California's Charmin Smith to the Pac-12 sidelines, although is a familiar face having been a long-time assistant coach on the Beard coaching staff. Prior to that she was a member of the Stanford coaching staff and helped the Cardinal advance to three NCAA Final Fours and three Pac-10 titles as a player.

The other 11 coaches return for 2019-20, including Hall of Fame head coach Tara VanDerveer who is in her 34th season at Stanford and is serving her 41st season as a head coach over three stops. The second-most tenured head coach in the Pac-12 is Arizona State's Charli Turner Thorne who is in her 23rd season with the Sun Devils. She is a graduate of Stanford where she was a guard for VanDerveer for three years. Oregon State's Scott Rueck celebrates his 10th season at the OSU helm where he turned around a program that won nine games in his first season to a program that has made six-straight NCAA Tournament programs, including a trip to the NCAA Final Four in 2016. The other eight coaches have served for single-digit tenures.
