## ACADEMIC SPOTLIGHT

Danusia Francis worked in the Athletics Peer Learning Lab as a Peer Learning Facilitator during the 2014-15 school year. ## UCLA Travels to Seattle for Sunday Meet

No. 7 UCLA (4-2, 3-1 in the Pac-12) travels to Washington (3-6, 2-2) for a Sunday, Feb. 21 meet at 1pm at Alaska Airlines Arena. The meet will be televised live on Pac-12 Networks, with Jim Watson and Samantha Peszek calling the action. This will be the first of two trips to Seattle in less than a month. The Bruins will return on Mar. 19 for the Pac-12 Championships.

## Sophina on Ellen

After a week in which she became a worldwide viral star, senior Sophina DeJesus made her biggest appearance yet with a guest turn on The Ellen Show on Wednesday. While at the Ellen Show, DeJesus did a modified version of her floor routine and reminisced with Ellen about her first appearance on the show 10 years ago when she performed with her dance crew Diamonds in the Rough. DeJesus and her teammates also danced on stage during a commercial break with dancer/actor/ Ellen DJ Stephen "tWitch" Boss.

DeJesus gained overnight fame when a video of her floor exercise routine went viral on Super Bowl weekend. The video has topped 28 million views on Facebook at 11 million on YouTube. DeJesus was the top trending topic on Facebook for two days and has been featured on countless news programs and websites around the world, including People Magazine, Time, New York Times, BuzzFeed, Upworthy, Good Morning America, The Today Show, NPR and Cosmo. Celebrities such as Reese Witherspoon, Jamie Foxx, Ludacris and Ashton Kutcher posted about her routine on social media.

## In the Rankings

UCLA remained at No. 7 in the national rankings but moved back to No. 1 on floor exercise. The Bruins are also ranked No. 7 on beam, No. 10 on vault and No. 15 on bars. UCLA has five athletes ranked in the Top 25 on floor - Sophina DeJesus, Hallie Mossett and Angi Cipra, who are tied for No. 8; Sadiqua Bynum, who is tied for 13th, and Madison Preston, who is tied for 25th. Three Bruins are ranked in the Top 25 on beam - Danusia Francis (2nd), Nicki Shapiro (4th) and DeJesus (23rd). Both Francis and Sonya Meraz moved into the Top 12 after their first all-around performances of the year. Francis ranks eighth, and Meraz is 12th.

## UCLA vs. Washington - The Matchup

UCLA leads the all-time regular season series with Washington, 60-3. The two teams faced each other twice last season, with UCLA winning the dual meet in Los Angeles, 197.000-194.500, and finishing ahead of Washington at the Pac-12 Championships. The Huskies are coming off their best performance of the season in a loss at Utah, scoring a season-high 196.250 and posting season-best team scores on vault (49.075) and floor (49.3). Allison Northey set a new career-high in the all-around with a 39.550.

## Last Time Out

UCLA scored season-highs on vault (49.35) and beam (49.5) en route to a season-high score of 197.475 in a late-night dual meet win over Oregon State, who scored 196.225, on Saturday. Three Bruins flirted with perfection, as Sophina DeJesus and Sadiqua Bynum earned scores of 9.975 on beam and floor, respectively, while Danusia Francis earned a 10 from one judge en route to a 9.95 on beam. Francis competed all-around for the first time in her four-year career and won the meet with a score of 39.45. Sonya Meraz was second with a career-high 39.4. Freshman Madison Preston picked up her first event win, tying with teammate JaNay Honest for first on vault with a 9.9.

## DeJesus Named Pac-12 Gymnast of the Week

Senior Sophina DeJesus was named the Pac-12 Gymnastics Specialist of the Week after scoring a near-perfect 9.975 on the balance beam against Oregon State on Saturday. Coming off a week in which she became a viral internet sensation, DeJesus gave another standout performance, this time on the beam. She came close to scoring a perfect 10 on the apparatus, receiving a 10 from one judge and a 9.95 from the other to shatter her career-high with a 9.975. It was her first career win on the beam, and it helped the Bruins set a new team season-high on the event with a 49.5. She followed up with a 9.9 on floor exercise to finish third. Her scores helped the Bruins defeat Oregon State with a season-best score of 197.475.

## High Marks

After six meets, UCLA has posted 11 9.95 scores this season - Danusia Francis three times on beam, Christine Peng-Peng Lee and Sophina DeJesus once on beam, Sadiqua Bynum three times on floor, Angi Cipra twice on floor and Hallie Mossett once on floor. Francis leads the crew with 12 9.95+ scores in her career (11 on beam and 1 on floor). Lee has eight (3 on bars, 5 on beam), Bynum has four, all on floor. Cipra has three on floor, and Mossett has one on floor. DeJesus has one each on bars and beam. The Bruins have also tallied 30 scores of 9.9 or higher this year and had a season-high eight in their last meet vs. Oregon State.

## Notables

Nine Bruins have hit all of their routines without a fall so far this season. Danusia Francis is 18-for-18, Sadiqua Bynum and JaNay Honest are 12-for-12, Madison Preston is 10-for-10, Mikaela Gerber and Napulani Hall are 8-for-8, and Melissa Metcalf is 4-for-4. Nicki Shapiro and Rechelle are 1-for-1 ... Francis has hit 53 routines in a row without a fall, with 49 of those routines scoring 9.8 or above ... Bynum hit all 23 routines in 2015 and has hit 42 in a row since 2014 ... Sophina DeJesus has scored 9.8 or higher on 15 of her last 16 beam routines ... So-

nya Meraz is a perfect 16-for-16 on beam in her career, with 11 of those routines scoring 9.8 or higher ... Hallie Mossett choreographed the floor exercise routines for JaNay Honest, Napualani Hall and Rechelle Dennis and helped head coach Valorie Kondos Field choreograph others on the team, including her own.

## Injury Update

Junior Hallie Mossett fractured her sternum and suffered an injury to her torso during uneven bars warmups on Feb. 13. Her injuries are stable, and doctors are regularly monitoring her progress. The timetable for her return is unknown. Freshman Katelyn Ohashi has been out since the Feb. 1 meet, but is progressing well with her sternum injury.

## Bruin Debuts

The last four meets have provided the Bruins opportunity to get new faces in the lineup. Rechelle Dennis and Nicki Shapiro made their competitive debuts on Saturday against Oregon State. Dennis scored 9.725 on bars, and Shapiro placed third on beam with a 9.9. Danusia Francis made her collegiate debut on vault and all-around and placed first in the all-around with a 39.45. Against Utah, Sophina DeJesus made her season debut on floor exercise and proceeded to break the interent with her routine. Also, Madison Preston competed on beam for the first time and scored 9.775. At Cal Feb. 1, Christine Peng-Peng Lee made her season debut on vault and stuck her Yurchenko full for a first-place 9.875 score. Mikaela Gerber came in on floor exercise as a last-minute sub and hit her routine for a 9.8. Also making their season competitive debuts were Stella Savvidou on bars and Angi Cipra on beam. At Arizona the week prior, Savvidou's first-ever Bruin routine, an exhibition on bars, resulted in a 9.75 score. Shapiro also made her Bruin debut with an exhibition beam performance that scored 9.725. Sonya Meraz and Preston competed on floor at Arizona for the first time this season and scored 9.8 and 9.875, respectively.

## Bluetooth Fading

For the first two weeks of the season, Christine Peng-Peng Lee had been performing a hands-free beam routine due to thumb surgery in November for a torn ligament. She brought back her Homma Flairs mount

on Jan. 23 at Arizona, marking the first step in her return to full usage of her hands, and returned to vault on Feb. 1 at Cal. Her progress continued the last two weeks, as she replaced the aerial in her aerial/back layout series with a backhandspring.

## Vault Changes

With the Yurchenko layout full and Yurchenko layout half vaults being devalued to 9.95 start values, several Bruins have been working on new vaults in 2016 to maintain a 10.0 start value. Two Bruins have competed 10.0 vaults in their four meets. Napualani Hall has scored career-highs of 9.9 on stuck Yurchenko 1.5s twice, and Sadiqua Bynum scored a season-high 9.875 on her Yurchenko Arabian at Arizona. JaNay Honest and Madison Preston have UCLA's highest score on a Yurchenko layout full with a 9.9s last week against Oregon State.

## Singing Bruins

Juniors Christine Peng-Peng Lee and Hallie Mossett and team manager Alex Waller made their vocal debut singing the national anthem at the Bruins' last home meet. On Friday, Feb. 12, they made their live television debut on the Pac-12 Networks, singing the national anthem live prior to UCLA-USC swimming and diving meet. The trio will also take their vocal talents to the UCLA-Oregon men's basketball game on Mar. 2.

## UCLA Dominates Pac-12 All-Century Team

UCLA Gymnastics dominated the Pac-12 All-Century Team, with 12 Bruins selected to the 16-gymnast roster, in addition to current head coach Valorie Kondos Field being named Coach of the Century and two-time NCAA all-around champion Tasha Schwikert being selected the Gymnast of the Century.

Also selected to the All-Century team from UCLA were Jill Andrews (balance beam), Mohini Bhardwaj (all-around, uneven bars, floor exercise), Jamie Dantzscher (floor exercise, all-around), Kim Hamilton (floor exercise), Kristen Maloney (vault), Heidi Moneymaker (vault), Samantha Peszek (balance beam, all-around), Kate Richardson (floor exercise), Schwikert (all-around), Sharon Shapiro (all-around), Stella Umeh (floor exercise) and Vanessa Zamarripa (vault).

## International Competitors

UCLA was well-represented at the 2015 World Championships in Glasgow, as senior Danusia Francis competed for Jamaica and freshman Stella Savvidou competed for Cyprus. Bruin signee Madison Kocian, who will defer enrollment until the 2017 season, won a pair of gold medals for the uneven bars and team competition. The Bruins have two other former World Championship competitors in Christine Peng-Peng Lee and Mikaela

Gerber, who were on Canada's 2011 Worlds team, and an American Cup (2013) and Pacific Rim Championship (2012) all-around champ in Katelyn Ohashi.

## About the Bruins

UCLA returns four All-Americans from last year's squad - Sadiqua Bynum (floor), Sophina DeJesus (bars), Danusia Francis (beam) and Christine Peng-Peng Lee (bars and beam). Newcomers to the squad this year include 2013 America Cup winner Katelyn Ohashi, 2014 Level 10 national vault champion Madison Preston, eight-time Region 1 champion Nicki Shapiro and 2015 World Championships competitor Stella Savvidou. Additionally, 2013 Level 10 national bars champion Melissa Metcalf is back after missing the 2015 season with a knee injury. Freshman Macy Toronjo, who won the 2015 Level 10 national all-around and floor titles, is out for the year after undergoing rotator cuff surgery.

The Bruins lost seven gymnasts from a year ago, most notably All-Americans Samantha Peszek and Jordan Williams. Peszek won the NCAA all-around and beam titles last season and finished her career as a 17-time All-American and a 2015 Academic All-American.

## Coming Back

UCLA returns 10 athletes who saw competition time a year ago and 17 of 24 routines (71%) competed at the 2015 NCAA Championships, including five each on bars and beam. The Bruins will need to replace 9.9+ scores from Samantha Peszek (all-around) and Jordan Williams (vault). Six Bruin returners scored at least one 9.9 last season - Sonya Meraz (1), Sophina DeJesus (2), Angi Cipra (3), Sadiqua Bynum (8), Danusia Francis (15), and Christine Peng-Peng Lee (15). Additionally, Lee pulled in seven scores of 9.95 or better, including one 9.975 on beam; Francis had five 9.95s, and Bynum had one, a 9.975 on floor.

## Pac-12 Networks to Televis 10 UCLA Meets

Nine of UCLA's 10 regular season meets, along with the Pac-12 Championships, will be televised live on Pac-12 Networks this season. Also televised live for the first time will be the NCAA Championships on Apr. 15 and 16 on ESPNU. UCLA's nine regular season televised meets are the most among the Pac-12 schools. New to the Pac-12 Networks' broadcast team is 2015 UCLA graduate Samantha Peszek, who will be a color analyst on three of UCLA's meets (at Cal, Oregon State and at Washington).

## UCLA Signs Glenn Twins in Early Period

UCLA signed twins Anna and Grace Glenn from Charlotte, NC (Southeastern Gymnastics) to National Letters of Intent in the fall signing period. The Glenns will join Olympic gold medalist Kyla Ross and current World uneven bars champion Madison Kocian in the freshman class of 2016-17.

Anna had an outstanding 2015 season, winning the silver medal in the all-around at the Nastia Liukin Supergirl Cup and placing sixth in the all-around and second on vault at the JO National Championships. She won the all-around, bars and beam at the Level 10 Regionals and swept every event and the all-around at the Level 10 State Championships. In 2014, she was sixth in the all-around and vault and second on beam at the JO Nationals and second in the all-around, vault, beam and floor at the Regional Championships. Anna placed third on vault and fourth on beam at the 2013 JO Nationals after winning the all-around at the Regional and State meets. She captured her first national title in 2012, winning uneven bars at JO Nationals. She also won the all-around at the 2012 Regionals and uneven bars at the State meet.

Grace, a three-time JO National Team member, placed fifth in the all-around, second on beam, third on vault and fourth on bars at the 2014 Nastia Liukin Supergirl Cup. She has had great success at the JO National Championships, winning the all-around and placing second on vault in 2014, as well as placing fourth in the all-around in 2013 and third in 2012. At the Regional level, she swept the all-around and all four events at the 2014 Championships and was the vault and bars champion in 2013 and vault and beam champion in 2012. Made her UCLA debut at Arizona with an exhibition beam performance that scored 9.725 ... Two other exhibition scores were 9.675 vs. Cal and 9.65 vs. Utah ... Fifth in the all-around, fourth on floor and eighth on beam at the 2012 Level 10 National Championships ... Earned eight Regional titles in her career ... Won the all-around, beam and floor and placed second on vault and third on bars at the 2012 Region 1 Championships ... Captured 2012 state titles in the all-around and beam and silver medals on vault and floor ... Seventh in the all-around and on beam and fifth on floor at the 2011 Level 10 Nationals ... Won the all-around, vault and floor and placed second on beam at the 2011 Region 1 Championships ... Won all-around, vault, floor and team gold medals at the Pan Am Maccabi Games in 2011 ... ## Head Coach Valorie Kondos Field

UCLA head coach Valorie Kondos Field has positioned her Bruins as one of the premier programs in collegiate gymnastics. Not only has she consistently recruited and coached some of the top talent in the world, but she has produced the results.

The Bruins won their first NCAA championship in 1997 under Kondos Field and won again in back-to-back seasons in both 2000-2001 and 2003-2004. In 2010, UCLA won its sixth NCAA title with a 24-for-24 performance in the Super Six. UCLA has remained the Leader of the Pac under Kondos Field's tenure, winning 12 conference titles, including the inaugural Pac-12 title in 2012, to go along with 17 NCAA Regional titles. In 2015, UCLA won the NCAA Regional title, and senior Samantha Peszek won the NCAA all-around and beam titles.

Kondos Field has been selected by her peers as the NACGC/W National Coach of the Year four times (1996, 1997, 2000 and 2001) and was also named the Pac-12 Coach of the Year in 1995, 2000, 2003 and 2012. Recently, she was selected the Pac-12 Coach of the Century. In 2010, she became just the second active coach to be inducted into the UCLA Athletics Hall of Fame.

Kondos Field, who is now in her 26th year as head coach of the Bruins, emphasizes a team concept, but her student-athletes have also found individual success, winning 27 NCAA individual titles during her years as head coach.

Her professional journey has been a unique one. A former professional ballet dancer with the Sacramento Ballet, Capital City Ballet and Washington, D.C. Ballet, she initially got her start in gymnastics at Agilites in Carmichael, Calif. by playing the piano for floor exercise music. From there, she became a dance coach, and under the guidance of former University of Minnesota co-head coach Jim Stephenson, learned the fundamentals of the sport. In 1983, she was hired to be UCLA's assistant coach and choreographer. While working under head coach Jerry Tomlinson, Kondos Field helped put UCLA Gymnastics on the map with their distinctive choreography and flair.

Kondos Field was appointed head coach of the Bruins in 1991 and brought in Scott Bull as her co-head coach. As the sole head coach in 1995, she earned Pac-10 and West Region coaching honors and guided her team to first-place finishes at the Pac-10 and Regional Championships. Just one year later, she led the Bruins to a runner-up finish at the NCAA Championships, and in 1997 she became just the fourth coach in NCAA history to win a national title.

In 26 years as Bruin head coach, Kondos Field holds a career record of 471-111-2 (.808 winning percentage).

## Associate Head Coach Chris Waller

Former UCLA All-American, NCAA Champion and U.S. Olympian Chris Waller is in his 14th season as an assistant coach for the UCLA women's gymnastics team and fourth as associate head coach.

Waller has brought nothing but success since returning to UCLA in 2003, helping guide the Bruins to three NCAA team titles. In his first season on the Bruin staff, he helped guide the Bruins to the 2003 NCAA, Regional and Pac-10 Championships. He was also the acting head coach when UCLA snapped the longest home court winning streak in NCAA history for any sport, handing Utah its first home loss in 23 years. In 2004, he helped coach the Bruins to a repeat championship, won in record-setting fashion. He was also selected by his peers as the 2004 NACGC National Assistant Coach of the Year. In 2010, he was voted the West Region Assistant Coach of the Year.

In 2004, Waller coached former Bruin great Mohini Bhardwaj as she earned not only a spot on the U.S. Olympic team but the honor of team captain as well. Bhardwaj led the U.S. to a silver medal and placed sixth in the floor exercise finals.

Waller coached another Bruin to elite success in 2010, helping guide Vanessa Zamarripa to the U.S. National Team after an eighth-place all-around finish at the Visa Championships.

One of the United States' all-time gymnastics greats, Waller was a member of the National Team from 1989-97 and captured the U.S. all-around crown in 1991 and pommel horse titles from 1991-93. He was an all-around finalist at the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona and took fifth on the pommel horse, just one-tenth of a point away from the gold medal. In addition, Waller placed in the Top 6 on the pommel horse at the 1993 World Championships and won three medals at the 1990 Goodwill Games and a team gold at the 1995 Pan American Games. He was inducted into the USA Gymnastics Hall of Fame in 2003.

At UCLA, Waller earned four All-America honors and helped the Bruins capture the NCAA title in 1987. He also won individual titles on the pommel horse in 1989 and the high bar in 1990. Every year from 1989-1993, Waller won either a U.S. or NCAA national title.

## Assistant Coach Randy Lane

Randy Lane is in the fifth year of his third stint as a Bruin assistant coach and his 12th year overall with the program.

In 2012, he was selected the West Region Assistant Coach of the Year and helped lead UCLA to the first-ever Pac-12 Championship, as well as a NCAA Regional championship and a third-place NCAA finish.

Lane previously coached at UCLA from 1992-94 and 1998-2001. He left coaching for a private business but returned to the sport as an assistant coach at Florida from 2002-06. He was an associate head coach at Michigan State from 2007-11 and had previously served as the head coach at UC Santa Barbara from 1995-97.

During Lane's second stint at UCLA, he helped guide the Bruins to NCAA titles in 2000 and 2001. UCLA gymnasts won eight NCAA individual titles from 1998-2001, including three on the event on which he was the lead coach, uneven bars. He was honored as the NACGC/W National Assistant Coach of the Year in 2000, and in 1998, he was named the West Region Assistant Coach of the Year.

Lane was a member of the 1989 Illinois NCAA Men's Gymnastics National Championship squad and the 1988 NCAA Championship runner-up squad. He was also a member of the 1988 and 1989 Big Ten Championship teams. While competing for the Columbus Gymnastics Center, he won the Indiana State all-around title eight times and was the 1984 AAU Junior Olympic National parallel bar champion. He was named the 1984 Indiana Outstanding Athlete over such notables as Indiana basketball legend, 1984 Olympic Gold Medalist and current UCLA basketball head coach Steve Alford.


