AROUND THE PAC-12

- ARIZONA won its 14th regular season Pac-12 title and then captured its fifth Pac-12 Tournament title, its first since 2002.
- Each of the four Pac-12 teams participating in the NCAA Tournament have captured an NCAA men's basketball title – Arizona (1997), Oregon (1939), Utah (1944), UCLA (1964-65, 1967-73, 1975 and 1995). That accounts for 14 of the league's 16 NCAA men's basketball titles.
- The Pac-12 posted a non-conference record of 108-41 (.725) ... In Pac-12 play, the home team is 77-39 (.664), which are the most combined wins by the home team ever in Pac-12 play.

PAC-12 MEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT RECAP

LAS VEGAS – The Arizona Wildcats are the undisputed champions of Pac-12 men's basketball after flexing their muscles in an 80-52 victory over Oregon in the Pac-12 Tournament championship on Saturday night in Sin City.

The victory represents the school's first Pac-12 Tournament title since Lute Olson led his team to the championship in 2002. Coach Sean Miller has been at the helm of the program since 2009, and well aware of the dry spell. But as he told the crowd – which was chock-full of Arizona fans for the third straight day – the monkey is off Arizona's back.

"The next time someone asks you when's the last time Arizona won the Pac-12 Tournament," Miller said from the podium at midcourt after the game, "you tell them 2015."

Fittingly, Olson was in the stands to see the No. 5 Wildcats (31-3) assert themselves against the Ducks, surrounded by thousands of fans decked out in red and blue and Arizona block 'A' logos on their chests. Miller made a point to praise Olson for establishing the winning culture that has defined Arizona's program for more than 30 years running.

"Everybody recognizes what he and his coaching staff did many, many years ago," Miller said. "Part of why we had the turnout here today, and why we have the homecourt that we have, is because of his efforts. Him being able to share those efforts is spectacular."

The Ducks (25-9) started off hot on Saturday night, jumping out to an impressive 10-4 lead to begin the game that had the rowdy crowd quieted, but that's about all they were able to accomplish as Arizona responded with 14 unanswered points and controlled the contest the rest of the way on a night that belonged to the Wildcats.

Tournament Most Outstanding Player Brandon Ashley led the way with 20 points for Arizona, while Stanley Johnson added 14 and McConnell chipped in 12 more.

Pac-12 Player of the Year Joe Young caught fire with eight quick points in one stretch in the second half, but shot just 7-of-19 from the floor en route to a team-high 19 points.

Tournament Notes: Arizona is the sixth different school in the last seven years to win the Pac-12 Tournament crown ... The last time the Conference regular season champion also won the Conference tournament title was 2008 (UCLA) ... Arizona's 28-point margin of victory is a Tournament record for the championship game ... Arizona's **Brandon Ashley** averaged 19.7 points/6.3 rebounds to garner Most Outstanding Player honors. He shot 73.1 percent shooting from the field, fifth-best at the tournament, and he also knocked down 21-of-24 free throws ... Oregon's **Joseph Young** scored 74 points (24.7 ppg) in three tournament games, which is the third most any player has ever scored in a Pac-12 Tournament ... Arizona and Oregon also faced each other in the 2014 Pac-12 Football Championship Game ... Five players set new career highs in points scored during the Tournament - Utah's **Brandon Taylor** (24 pts vs. Oregon) Cal's **David Kravish** (25 pts vs. Washington State), USC's **Elijah Stewart** (27 pts vs. Arizona State), UCLA's **Isaac Hamilton** (36 pts vs. USC) and Ashley (24 pts vs. UCLA) ... The Tournament drew 70,563 fans (11,761 per session) with four of the six sessions sold out at 12,916 per session.

PAC-12 IN NCAA TOURNAMENT PLAY

The Pac-12 Conference has won more NCAA basketball titles (16) than any other conference in the country . . . Oregon's Tall Firs won the first NCAA Championship in 1939. Stanford claimed the national title in 1942, followed by Utah in 1944 and California in 1959 . . . UCLA established a basketball dynasty that included 10 titles in 12 seasons and a winning streak of seven consecutive NCAA crowns . . . In 1997, Arizona became the sixth different Pac-12 institution to capture the NCAA basketball title.

- ARIZONA is currently riding a 38-game winning streak at McKale Center, which currently stands as the longest active streak in the nation, and the fifth-longest in program history. Since 2010-11, the Wildcats lead the Pac-12 in home court winning percentage and is 80-6 (.930)... In the Huntsman Center, UTAH is 34-3 (.919) over the last two seasons ... COLORADO is now 71-14 (.835) at the Coors Events Center under coach Tad Boyle... OREGON STATE was 15-2 at Gill Coliseum, their most home wins in a season in program history ... In Pac-12 play, the home team is 77-39 (.664), which are the most combined wins by the home team ever in Pac-12 play. The best winning percentage by the home teams in Conference play came in 1991 when the hosts were victorious 72.7 percent of the time (64-26) ... Overall, Pac-12 teams have racked up a 159-49 (.764) home court record this season.
- The Pac-12 currently has three teams allowing under 60 points per game - UTAH (56.9 ppg), ARIZONA (58.6 ppg) and OREGON STATE (59.2 ppg). Should that hold up through the end of the season, it would mark the first time in the shot clock era (started with the 1985-86 season) that three league teams held opponents under 60 points per game. That last time it occurred was during the 1983-84 season when Oregon State (55.8 ppg), Washington (58.7 ppg) and California (58.7 ppg) accomplished the feat.
- STANFORD senior guard **Chasson Randle** and OREGON senior guard **Joseph Young** are two of 11 active players in NCAA Division I that have 2,000 career points. Randle currently has 2,257 points while Young has 2,247 points (1,331 at Oregon, 916 at Houston) ... Randle is sixth on the Pac-12 career scoring list, and is seventh all-time in the Conference with a school-record 291 three-point field goals ... Young has netted 279 points the last 12 games (23.3 ppg). Young's 1,331 points at Oregon are the most by a Duck over a two-year period.
- ARIZONA won its third Pac-12 regular season title in five years, and its 14th overall. The Wildcats currently do not have a player ranked among the top 10 in the Pac-12 in scoring as freshman **Stanley Johnson** is ranked 13th (14.1 ppg). That's rare for the outright champion not to have its leading scorer ranked among the league's top 10. It's occurred just three times in the previous 36 seasons (starting with the first Pac-10 season in 1978-79) - 2003 (Arizona), 1999 (Stanford) and 1991 (Arizona) ... While Stanford had no scorers among the top 10 in 2000, it did share the title with Arizona, which had three players among the top 10. Likewise in 1990 when Arizona and Oregon State shared the title. Arizona had no scorers among the top 10, but Oregon State did have one.
- ARIZONA is 8-3 (.727) under Miller in the NCAA Tournament, reaching three Sweet 16s and two Elite Eights. Miller is one of five coaches nationally to reach at least five Sweet 16s since 2008 ... Arizona has 144 victories since the start of the 2010-11 season, the fourth-best total nationally; UA has won 30 games in consecutive seasons for the first time in program history and owns four 25-win seasons under Miller. ... Ranked third nationally in adjusted defensive efficiency, UA has held 77 of its last 79 opponents under the 80-point. UA is allowing just 0.86 points per possession and has held 21 opponents under 60 points on the season ... Senior guard **T.J. McConnell** leads the Pac-12 in assists (218/6.4 apg) and turnover margin (+3.3) ... Arizona is 25-0 this season when its bench outscores its opponent's reserves ... Arizona has been ranked in 58-straight AP polls, including 38-straight weeks in the top 10.
- UTAH joins Gonzaga and North Carolina Central as the only NCAA Division I teams to rank in the top 13 in both field goal percentage and defensive field goal percentage. The Utes are 13th in field goal percentage (48.5 percent) and 10th in defensive field goal percentage (38.3) ... Utah has the most wins of any team in the nation by 20 or more points (15) and they are sixth nationally in scoring margin (+15.2) ... **Delon Wright**, the USBWA District VIII Player of the Year, has been named as a finalist for the Wooden, Cousy and Naismith Awards. On pace to become just the second Ute to amass 1,000 points, 375 rebounds, 350 assists, 150 steals and 70 blocks in a career (Josh Grant).
- OREGON has won 13 of its last 16 with the losses coming to NCAA Tournament teams Arizona and UCLA, all away from home ... The Ducks have won 20 games for a fifth consecutive season, all under coach Dana Altman, a program first ... It's won a school-record 122 games the past five years ... Senior guard **Joseph Young** is shooting 89.6 percent (267-of-298) for his career from the free throw line. Should he maintain that clip through the rest of the season, he'll be the Pac-12's most efficient free throw shooter. Former California guard Jerome Randle holds the Pac-12 record at 88.1 percent (393-of-446) from 2007-10 ... Freshman **Jordan Bell** set a school record with 86 blocked shots and led the league with 2.6 blocks per game.
- UCLA has posted a 20-win season for the 32nd time in the last 40 seasons (dating back to when the late coach John Wooden retired in 1975) ... Senior guard **Norman Powell** (16.4 ppg, 4.7 rpg) has played in all 138 games for UCLA the past four seasons ... Freshman forward **Kevon Looney** (11.8 ppg, 9.2 rpg, 14 double-doubles) ranks second among all freshmen in the nation with 9.2 rebounds per game. His 14 double-doubles are tops in the country among freshmen.

PAC-12 IN NIT/CBI TOURNAMENT PLAY

National Invitation Tournament: The Pac-12 has had considerable success in the National Invitation Tournament (NIT), as five current members have captured the NIT crown - Colorado (1940), Utah (1947), UCLA (1985), Stanford (1991 and 2012) and California (1999). Colorado also finished second in 1991, as did Utah in 1974. Meanwhile third-place finishes were turned in by Oregon in 1975 and 2004, Colorado in 1955 and 2011, Utah in 1992, and Washington State in 2011. The league now stands at 92-79 (.538) in America's original postseason tourney. The records of all Pac-12 members in the NIT and CBI:

College Basketball Invitational: The 16-team field was created for the 2007-08 season. In just the second year of its existence, Oregon State captured the CBI crown. The Pac-12 made it two-in-a-row as Oregon followed with a CBI title of its own in 2011.

- ARIZONA STATE is the only team to beat the Pac-12 champions in each of the past three seasons, having knocked off Arizona this season and last season, then defeating league-champ UCLA in 2013 ... When senior forward **Jon Gilling** takes the floor vs. UConn, it will be his 131st game in a Sun Devil uniform, matching Derek Glasser for the school record. Also, Gilling is closing in on the 1,000 point mark, as he has 992 career points ... In his past 15 games freshman point guard Tra Holder is averaging 9.9 points and has made 64-of-85 (.753) of his free throws. His 108 assists is tied with Eddie House (1996-97) for fourth on the Sun Devil freshman list, behind only James Harden (110/2007-08), Bobby Thompson (114/1983-84) and Jahii Carson (177/2012-13) ... After not playing in a college hoops game for 635 days and missing the first nine games this year after transferring, sophomore forward **Savon Goodman** in the past 11 games is averaging 13.0 points and 8.6 rebounds while shooting 58-of-91 (.637) from the field.
- STANFORD is 13-5 all-time in NIT play, with a pair of titles coming in 1991 and 2012. Stanford is 38-22 all-time in 25 postseason appearances overall ... Senior center **Stefan Nastic** is 46-54 (85.2 percent) from the charity stripe over his last eight games ... Stanford is averaging only 10.7 turnovers per game, a total that leads the Pac-12 and ranks 32nd-best in the country. The Cardinal has committed 10 miscues or fewer in 17 games ... Senior tri-captains **Anthony Brown**, **Stefan Nastic** and **Chasson Randle** are currently completing coursework toward their master's degrees and exhibiting strong leadership on the court - Brown (communication major, 3.26 undergraduate GPA), a fifth-year senior, is working toward a coterminal M.A. in the media studies program. Fellow fifth-year senior Nastic (psychology major, 3.10 undergraduate GPA) is progressing toward a coterminal M.A. in the communication program. Randle (African and African-American studies major, 3.34 undergraduate GPA) is set to complete both his undergraduate degree and master's degree in four years. Randle has been accepted into the department of psychology's master's program.
- COLORADO senior guard **Askia Booker** (17.2 ppg) has 1,740 career points and ranks sixth on CU's all-time scoring list. Booker has played in 134 games during his career, ranking second on CU's all-time list. Booker also is one of three players in school history to reach 1600 points, 400 rebounds, 300 assists, 140 steals in a career... **Josh Scott** (14.0 ppg/8.0 rpg) and **Wesley Gordon** (6.8 ppg/6.9 rpg) are looking to become the first CU teammates to average 7.0+ rebounds since 2003-04 (David Harrison: 8.8; Lamar Harris: 8.5). Gordon and Josh Scott are the first CU teammates to record back-to-back 40 block seasons.
- WASHINGTON STATE sophomore forward **Josh Hawkinson** posted a school-record 20 double-doubles. Hawkinson is currently fifth nationally in double-doubles ... Hawkinson has the best rebound improvement and second-best scoring improvement in the nation compared to last year. His rebounding numbers went from 1.6 rpg to a Pac-12 leading 10.8 rpg, while his scoring numbers improved from 1.2 ppg to 14.7 ppg.
- OREGON STATE junior guard **Gary Payton II** leads the league with 95 steals and is tied for third for most in a single-season in Pac-12 history. On the school charts, he only trails his father's 100 thefts set in 1990.
- CALIFORNIA senior forward **David Kravish** concluded his career with 1,266 points, 917 rebounds and 226 blocked shots. His rebound totals rank third in school history and 26th on the Pac-12 career list, while his blocked shots total are a school record and are 5th all-time in the Pac-12 record book.

PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE YEAR - Joseph Young, Oregon

YOUNG is Oregon's fourth Player of the Year, joining the likes of former Duck guards Ron Lee (1975-76), Terrell Brandon 1990-91), and Luke Ridnour (2002-03) with his honor. The senior guard from Houston, Texas, averaged 19.8 points and 3.7 assists through the regular season, leading Oregon to a 23-8 overall record and a 13-5 mark in Pac-12 play that landed the Ducks in a second-place tie. Young also paced the league in free throw percentage (.918) and three-point field goals made per game (2.5). In two seasons at Oregon, Young scored 1,257 points. Only Terrell Brandon scored more during a two-year period with 1,263 points. Combining his two seasons at Houston, Young has scored 2,173 points in his college career.

PAC-12 FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR - Stanley Johnson, Arizona

JOHNSON makes it back-to-back Freshman of the Year accolades for the Wildcats as he follows last year's recipient Aaron Gordon. He's the fourth Wildcat to earn the honor in the last nine years, and the eighth overall since the award's inception following the 1978-79. He averaged a team-leading 13.9 points, which was most among all Pac-12 freshmen, and 6.6 rebounds per game. A finalist for the Tisdale Award, honoring the nation's top freshman, Johnson also finished the regular season ranked in the top 10 in the Conference in steals per game (fifth, 1.5 spg).

PAC-12 DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR - Gary Payton II, Oregon State

PAYTON II is the third Beaver to be voted Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year, joining his father Gary Payton (1986-87) and Seth Tarver (2009-10). After the older Payton won the honor in 1987, the league discontinued the award until it was reinstated in 2008. The junior finished the regular season with a league-leading 92 steals (3.1 spg). His 92 thefts are fifth-most in a single season in Pac-12 history and only trails his father's school record 100 steals set in 1990. Payton was key in leading the Beavers' defense, allowing just 58.5 ppg, which ranked second in the Pac-12.

PAC-12 MOST IMPROVED PLAYER OF THE YEAR - Josh Hawkinson, Washington State

HAWKINSON becomes the second Cougar (also, Brock Motum in 2011-12) to receive the Most Improved Player of the Year award. After averaging 1.2 points and 1.6 rebounds per game during his freshman season, Hawkinson exceeded all expectations as he averaged 14.7 points and a league-leading 10.8 rebounds. He grabbed a school single-season record 19 double-doubles, passing Jim McKean's record of 17 in 1967. He also etched his name in the WSU record book as he grabbed a single-season record-tying 323 rebounds. His 19 double-doubles currently ranks fifth among Division I players.

PAC-12 JOHN R. WOODEN COACH OF THE YEAR - Dana Altman, Oregon

ALTMAN guided Oregon to a tie for a second-place finish in the Pac-12 race after being picked to finish eight by the media in the annual preseason Pac-12 Men's Basketball poll. Oregon posted a final record of 23-8 overall and 13-5 in Pac-12. Under Altman, the Ducks have posted 20 or more wins in a school-record five consecutive seasons. Altman's career record stands at 530-298 over his 26 seasons of head coaching, including a 120-55 record in five seasons at Oregon. He now has 18 consecutive winning seasons as a head coach (13 at Creighton, 5 at Oregon). Only six other active coaches in Division I can stake that claim – Mike Krzyzewski, Tom Izzo, Roy Williams, Bill Self, Jim Boeheim and Stew Morrill. Second time in three seasons that Altman has been honored as the league's Coach of the Year, and the fourth time an Oregon coach has earned the distinction – Altman (2015, 2013), Ernie Kent (2002), and Dick Harter (1977).
