



2017 PAC-12 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT

Post-Game Notes

GAME 11: #2 Stanford (48), #1 Oregon State (43)
Sunday, March 5, 2017

Stanford is the 2017 Pac-12 Women's Basketball Tournament Champion and earns the conference's automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament. Stanford won its 12th title and 2nd in three years.

Tonight's attendance was 6,829, a record for a Tournament championship game (5,349 in 2002). The overall Tournament attendance of 36,777 was also a record (27,613, last season). The top 3 attendance marks in the history of the Tournament occurred this year (2nd session Friday-9,686, semifinals-8,384, and tonight).

This game tied for the lowest scoring championship game in Tournament history, with 91 points (91, 2008, Stanford 56, Cal 35). Stanford's total (48 points) was the lowest by a winner in a title game (2004, Stanford 51, Arizona 46 and 2013, Stanford 51, UCLA 49).

Stanford is the first #2 seed to win the Tournament championship. This game was the 2nd in the Tournament in which the lower seed triumphed (Oregon over Washington).

After scoring a combined 13 points in the first 2 Tournament games, Stanford's Alanna Smith scored 12 points in the 1st half. She earned her 11th double-figure scoring game this season (3rd highest overall).

Sydney Wiese (OSU) had her 29th 10+ point scoring game this season and 3rd of the Tournament. Marie Gulich had her 2nd double-double in as many games (7th of season.)

Karlie Samuelson (Stan.) scored in double-digits for the 23rd game this season and 2nd in the Tournament.

Stanford blocked 26 shots in the Tournament, setting a record (25, Oregon State, 2014). It was also the first team to be perfect from the line in a title game (7 of 7).

At the first timeout, OSU had a 16-3 advantage (the Cardinal had trailed by at most 9 in its previous two Tournament games.) The Beavers scored 10 of those points off 4 Stanford turnovers.

Stanford was the lower seed for only the second time in Tournament history (2015, semifinal, #3 Stanford 59, #2 ASU 56).
