



## **2017 PAC-12 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT**

### **Post-Game Notes**

GAME 8: #6 Oregon (70), #3 Washington (69),  
Friday, March 3, 2017

Tonight's attendance of 9,686 was the largest in the 16-year history of the Tournament. The old record was 6,543, set at KeyArena last year in the semifinal round (3/5/16).

Oregon advances and will play #2 Stanford in tomorrow's 2<sup>nd</sup> semifinal Tournament game. Oregon has appeared in the semifinal twice, in 2002 and 2005, losing each year to Arizona State.

Its #3 seed is Washington's highest since 2003 (#2). This season is the first one since 2008 that the Huskies have earned a first round bye in the Tournament.

#6 Oregon is the lone team to have beaten a higher seed in the Tournament thus far.

The game featured 11 lead changes and 10 ties. It was the 2<sup>nd</sup> 1 point ball game in the Tournament and only the 8<sup>th</sup> in history.

There were only 4 bench points in the game, 2 by each team.

Oregon's 11 3-point field goals made tied for 3<sup>rd</sup> most in Tournament history.

Chantel Osahor, the nation's leading rebounder, broke the Tournament record for rebounds in a single game with 27. (21, three times, including once by Oregon's Jillian Alleyne in 2014). Osahor snared her 10<sup>th</sup> of the game with 6:42 to go in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter. (28<sup>th</sup> double-digit game out of 31 this season.)

Osahor also recorded her 27<sup>th</sup> double-double of the season, which leads the nation.

Oregon's Lexi Bando became the 28<sup>th</sup> player in school history to reach 1,000 career points (1,009).

Four Ducks scored in double-figures: Maite Cazorla, Bando (2 points off her season high), Sabrina Ionescu (18 points, 6 rebounds, 6 assists), and Hebard (13 points, 9 rebounds).

With 6:09 to go in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter, Kelsey Plum, the nation's leading scorer, became just the 3<sup>rd</sup> player in Division 1 history to score 1,000 points in a single season. Plum has scored 21+ points in all 32 games this season.

Plum's 33 field goal attempts set a Tournament record (29, Nikki Blue, UCLA vs. ASU, 3/5/05). She tied Tournament record for field goals made with 15 (15, Nnemkadi Ogwumike, Stan. Vs. Arizona, 3/11/11)
