



## **2019 PAC-12 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT**

### **Post-Game Notes**

GAME 6: #1 Oregon (77), #8 Arizona (63)  
Friday, March 8, 2019

Oregon has won 2 of 5 Tournament games vs. Arizona. Overall, it is 10-16 in the Tournament. The Ducks make its fourth semifinal round appearance when they play #4 UCLA at 6:00 p.m. PT.

The Ducks are one step closer to becoming the 2<sup>nd</sup> team to win back to back Tournament titles (Stanford has streaks of 3 and 7) and the first to do so since 2013.

The Ducks are now 6-1 in the last 3 Tournaments; their record was 4-15 in the prior 15.

Arizona's Aari McDonald had the 4<sup>th</sup> (tied) best scoring performance in a Tournament game. (34, Kelsey Plum, Wash., 2017, Kristine Anigwe, Cal., 2017 and Lia Galdeira, WSU, 2015). It was also the most by a Wildcat in a Tournament game (26, LaBrittney Jones, vs. Oregon, 3/3/16).

Ionescu tied the Tournament single game record for assists with 13 (13, Ionescu, 2018 and Marta Sniezek, Stan., 2016). She is now 2<sup>nd</sup> on the career Tournament assists list with 48, one back of the record of 49 held by Jordin Canada and Nikki Blue, both of UCLA. She also had her 2<sup>nd</sup> career Tournament double-double.

Arizona's Aari McDonald scored 34 points today, moving her into 7<sup>th</sup> place on the conference's single season scoring list with 774 points, passing Kelsey Plum, Wash., (746, 2015), Sabrina Ionescu, Ore. (748, 2018), and Kate Starbird, Stan. (753, 1997). McDonald's point total is now the most by a conference sophomore (passing these seasons by Plum and Ionescu.)

Oregon's Ruthy Hebard recorded her 11<sup>th</sup> double-double of the season and first in 6 games.
