## TEAMS COMPETE FOR PAC-12 TOURNAMENT CROWN IN SEATTLE

- In what has been one of the most competitive seasons in Pac-12 women's basketball history, the teams have reached the pinnacle as all 12 teams get set for the Pac-12 Women's Basketball Tournament at KeyArena in Seattle. The winner of the tournament secures the Conference's automatic bid.

- OREGON STATE claimed its third-consecutive Pac-12 regular-season title and third-straight No. 1 seed, posting a 16-2 league record. The Beavers are the six-ranked team in the country leading four ranked teams, all in the top 15. STANFORD, UCLA and WASHINGTON all secured first-round byes in the Pac-12 Tournament.

- WASHINGTON's Kelsey Plum capped her Senior Day with one of the most historic performances in NCAA history. She netted a Pac-12 and school record 57 points to claim the NCAA scoring title. She also tied the Conference record for field goals made and also took down the league's single-season scoring record. She was voted Pac-12 Player of the Week and also earned her third ESPNW National Player of the Week honor.

- Plum was also voted the Pac-12 Player of the Year in a vote of the Conference's coaches. She is the first Husky since 2003 to earn the honor. OREGON's Sabrina Ionescu was voted the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year becoming the first Duck to claim the award since 1999. OSU's Gabriella Hanson was voted the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year, keeping the award in Corvallis for the third-straight year. And for the second time in three years the Beavs' Scott Rueck is the John R. Wooden Pac-12 Coach of the Year.

- The Conference office announced the All-Pac-12, All-Freshman and All-Defensive teams on Tuesday. Among the 15 players voted to the all-conference team by the league's head coaches, Plum and OSU's Sydney Wiese earned a spot on the all-Conference team for the fourth-consecutive year, while ARIZONA STATE's Sophie Brunner earns her third all-Conference nod. CALIFORNIA's Kristine Anigwe, STANFORD's Erica McCall and UCLA's Jordyn Canada make their second appearances on the All-Pac-12 team. UO's Ionescu and teammate Ruthy Hebard are the only freshmen on the 15-player team.

- The Pac-12 is the only conference in the country to have four teams in the RPI's top 10 and 10 of the 12 teams have a RPI in the top 100.

- All 11 games of the Pac-12 Tournament will be nationally televised again. The first round through semifinal round, March 2-4, will be broadcast on Pac-12 Network. The championship game will be televised on ESPN2.

## CREDENTIAL PICKUP

Credential pickup will be available for pickup at KeyArena (305 Harrison Street, Seattle, WA 98109) Wednesday, March 1 through Sunday, March 5, according to the following schedule:

The media entrance is located off Thomas Street between 1st Avenue N and 2nd Avenue N adjacent to the loading dock entrance.

## PARKING:

Media parking is available on a limited basis across the street from the KeyArena loading dock entrance on Thomas Street. Please indicate if you will need parking when applying for credentials. Parking passes will be distributed on-site when you pick up your credential. We ask that you park first, pick up your credential, then return to your car with the parking pass. You may access the parking lot from Thomas Street or Warren Street.

## TRANSPORTATION:

KeyArena is easily accessible via public transportation and is highly encouraged. The Seattle Center Monorail can whisk you to the arena from downtown in 2 minutes ([www.seattlemonorail.com](http://www.seattlemonorail.com)) and 15 Metro bus routes serve the Center from around the city ([www.metro.kingcounty.gov](http://www.metro.kingcounty.gov)). Taxi cab company phone numbers will be posted in the media work room as a courtesy but is at your expense.

## IN-GAME LIVE STATS:

There are a limited number of stat monitors available and priority will be given to television and radio broadcasting the game. A link to real-time updates via the Stat Broadcast System will be provided on-site. The link is for media-use only and should not be shared with the general public. However, you are welcome to share the link with media who are unable to attend the Pac-12 Women's Basketball Tournament. Team and individual player game stats, as well as a live play-by-play, will be updated as play is happening.

## TEAM, TOURNAMENT AND POSTGAME STATISTICS:

Halftime and final box scores will be distributed for each game.

Printed copies of the full final book (final box score and play-by-play) will not be distributed. A complete play-by-play will be available via the Stat Broadcast system (link will be provided on-site). Once statistics are verified, box scores and play-by-plays will also be posted on the Conference's official website at <http://pac-12.com/content/womens-basketball-statistics> (click on 20016-17, then the box score link of the game desired) or at <http://pac-12.com/2014-pac-12-womens-basketball-tournament/statistics>. PDFs of the full book will also be emailed to the media.

## ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM MEDIA VOTING:

Media attending the Pac-12 Women's Basketball Tournament are asked, and encouraged, to vote for the all-tournament team and the tournament's most outstanding player by the 4-minute mark of the second half of the championship game. This year's voting will take place electronically via the Stat Broadcast system. The voting link is available at the live stats link that will be provided on-site. The voting will open on Saturday, March 4.

## WIRELESS CAPABILITIES/PHONE LINES:

KeyArena courtside press seating area, media work room and interview room will be equipped with a wireless network, free of charge, for members of the media. Media members wishing to install their own phone line at their press row seat location or in the media work room should call Tim Wass at CCPI (206/505-5493) and ask for information on Pac-12 Tournament phone line installation.

## SEAT ASSIGNMENTS:

Press row seat assignments at KeyArena will be made by the Media Director and may change from session to session. Due to limited space on press row, please check the seating assignments for each session.

A work area has been designated for photographers and videographers in the Media Work Room in the press conference area.

## ORIGINATING RADIO STATIONS:

Four radio positions have been established at press row. Seating charts will be posted with seat assignments. Phone lines (2 analog) and ethernet lines have been installed. Originating radio stations will have access to these positions for their game only. Please check the seating chart for seat assignments.

## PHOTO POLICY:

During games, still photographers may only work from designated areas on the court, behind each baseline. Photographers will not be allowed to shoot from press row. Photographers must wear a credential at all times while working in the baseline areas. Photographers will need to check in with the Photo Marshall on a daily basis. Handheld strobes and flashes are not permitted, nor are tripods or attachments to the basket standard.

## 2017 PAC-12 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT KEYARENA, SEATTLE, WASH. • THURSDAY-SUNDAY, MARCH 2-5

After drawing a record attendance in 2016 and near-record crowds the previous three seasons, the 16th-annual Pac-12 Women's Basketball Tournament remains in Seattle in partnership with Force 10 Sports Marketing, LLC, the Seattle Sports Commission and Seattle Center. The tournament will be held at KeyArena from March 2-5, 2017 and will receive unprecedented national television coverage once again with each game of the tournament scheduled to be televised either on the Pac-12 Networks or ESPN2.

The City of Seattle has embraced women's basketball and women's athletics. The WNBA's Seattle Storm loyal fan base has increased over the last several years. The majestic city provides convenient travel for teams and fans, with non-stop flights available from every Pac-12 city. In the three years the Pac-12 Tournament has been in the Emerald City, the four-day event has seen its biggest successes, recording three of the top four attendances in the 14-year history. The 2015 championship game was the second-most attended in the history of the event.

The Pac-12 Women's Basketball Tournament made its debut in 2002 and was held on the University of Oregon campus in Eugene, Ore. The Conference's premier women's sporting event then moved to HP Pavilion at San Jose for a six-year run (2003-08). It spent four years (2008-2012) in Los Angeles, with Galen Center playing host. The final two-year run of the event saw it combined with the men's tournament and the semifinal and championship games were played at the STAPLES Center.

The winner of the 12-team tournament receives the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship. The tournament seeding and Conference Champion are determined by the 18-game regular-season Pac-12 schedule.

### PAC-12 TOURNAMENT STRUCTURE-SEEDING & TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURES

#### 1. Seeding and Tie Breakers

All Conference teams that are eligible for post-season play shall participate in the Tournament. The seeding and pairings shall be determined upon completion of the regular season. The won-lost percentage record of the teams in regular season Conference play will determine seeding. This shall apply even in the event one or more teams cannot play its entire 18-game Conference schedule. An ineligible team's record and place in the final standings will be utilized in any tiebreaker situations. The team with the best winning percentage in Conference play will be seeded No. 1, the next best winning percentage in Conference play will be seeded No. 2, and so forth.

#### 2. Tie Breakers

Tie breaking procedures for determining all Tournament seeding will be:

##### Two-team tie

- Results of head-to-head competition during the regular season.
- Each team's record vs. the team occupying the highest position in the final regular-season standings, and then continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.

When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tie-breaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams.

- Won-lost percentage against all Division I opponents.
- Coin toss conducted by the Commissioner or designee.

##### Multiple-team tie

- Results of collective head-to-head competition during the regular season among the tied teams.
- If more than two teams are still tied, each of the tied team's record vs. the team occupying the highest position in the final regular season standings, and then continuing down through the standings, eliminating tied teams with inferior records until one team gains an advantage.

When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tie-breaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams.

If at any point the multiple-team tie is reduced to two teams, the two-team tie-breaking procedures will be applied.

- Winning percentage against all Division I opponents.
- Coin toss conducted by the Commissioner or designee.

If a coin toss is needed to establish the final seeding and pairings, it will be administered by Commissioner Larry Scott. Each institution involved in the coin toss is entitled to have a representative present. If a representative does not attend, the institution will be advised of the results immediately upon completion. Results of the coin toss will be made available to the wire services and other media outlets by 5 p.m. PST on Sunday, February 28, 2016.

## OREGON STATE CLAIMS REGULAR-SEASON TITLE

Oregon State won its third-straight Pac-12 regular-season crown and third-consecutive No. 1 seed at the Pac-12 Tournament. The Beavers recorded a record of 16-2 in league and goes into this week's tournament on a five-game winning streak.

## FIVE PAC-12 TEAMS RANKED

Four Pac-12 teams continue to be ranked in the *Associated Press* and *USA Today/WBCA* Coaches polls. After winning the Pac-12 regular-season title, Oregon State is ranked No. 6 in both national polls, its highest rating of the season after starting the year ranked No. 25.

Stanford is ranked No. 10/9, Washington is No. 11/10 and UCLA is 15th in both.

On December 26, seven Pac-12 teams were ranked for the first time ever in the *Associated Press* poll. Eight teams in all were ranked in either one poll or the other the week of December 18. Since Nov. 18 From Nov. 28-Jan. 9, at least since Pac-12 teams were ranked in a single poll.

## MS. 3,000 - PLUM BREAKS NCAA SCORING RECORD

Going into her final regular-season home game of the season on Feb. 25 and needing 54 points to take down the record, Washington's Kelsey Plum put on a show and scored a Pac-12 single-game and school record 57 points to claim the all-time NCAA scoring record, breaking a 16-year old mark set by Missouri State's Jackie Stiles (3,393). Plum was 19-for-28 from the floor, 6-for-11 from three-point distance and 13-for-16 from the free throw line.

Plum eclipsed the 3,000-point plateau on Jan. 13, becoming the 12th player in NCAA history to reach the milestone while also becoming the first Pac-12 player, men's or women's, to surpass it.

Plum has passed former great players such as USC-great Cheryl Miller, Tennessee's Chamique Holdsclaw, Connecticut's Maya Moore and Delaware's Ellena Delle Donne. Missouri State's Jackie Stiles owns the all-time NCAA record with 3,393 points set in 2001.

## FOUR PAC-12 TEAMS IN NCAA TOP-16

Four Pac-12 teams were announced among the NCAA's Top-16, which was announced on Monday night. The seeding announcement is meant for the public to have an insight into the Committee's thinking at this time during the season. It is the second such announcement of the season.

The first announcement on Jan. 23 featured five Pac-12 teams. Still in this week's announcement were No. 8 Oregon State, No. 10 Stanford, No. 12 Washington and No. 13 UCLA.

The seeding announcement is meant for the public to have an insight into the Committee's thinking at this time during the season, if the season ended today. The top-16 seeds earn the right to host first- and second-round NCAA Tournament games, if the host-site is available. The NCAA Tournament bracket will be announced on Monday, March 13.

## BRACKETOLOGY NOD

In the latest ESPN Bracketology dated Feb. 28, ESPN's Charlie Creme believes six Pac-12 teams would receive NCAA Tournament berths, if the season ended today, the third-most of any conference.

The Pac-12 currently has the No. 1 RPI in the country with 10 of 12 teams in the top 100, including four in the top 10.

The Dec. 12 bracketology had an amazing 10 teams listed as deserving of a NCAA Tournament bid.

The last time the Conference had six NCAA Tournament teams was in 2006. That same year, Utah also received a bid as a member of the Mountain West Conference.

## WIESE BREAKS 3-POINT RECORD; PLUM NOT FAR BEHIND

Plum is not the only one breaking records. OREGON STATE's Sydney Wiese topped four-time Stanford All-American Candice Wiggins in the three-point category. Wiese is the first player in Conference history to make 300-career threes.

Wiese also just entered the NCAA's three-point field goal career list, currently sitting in 16th entering the final week of the regular season.

Plum moved into second on the Pac-12's career list, not far behind Wiese. Plum became just the second player in league history to crack 300 in the category.

## VANDERVEER TOPS 1,000 WINS

In her 31st season on the bench at Stanford and over 37 years as a head coach, Hall of Famer Tara VanDerveer became just the second NCAA division I women's basketball head coach, and just the third men's or women's head basketball coach to reach 1,000 career wins on Feb. 3. She joins an exclusive club that includes the late Pat Summitt of Tennessee and Duke's Mike Krzyzewski. VanDerveer's teams have won 20 or more games 31 times, including each of the last 15 seasons. In 2013, she became just the fifth college women's basketball coach to win 900 career games.

## PLUM BREAKS ALL-TIME SCORING RECORD

The most prolific scorer in Pac-12 history, Washington's Kelsey Plum broke the Pac-12's all-time scoring record in just the 11th game of her senior campaign, surpassing 2014 WNBA Rookie of the Year Chiney Ogumike of Stanford. The fastest in league history to 2,000-career points, she is only the third player in Conference history to score at least 2,500 points, having scored over 700 points in each of her three seasons. Her name in the top five all-time is among elite company, with two WNBA Rookies of the Year, two No. 1 WNBA picks, four WNBA first-round picks, two WNBA Most Valuable Players and a pair of WNBA Champions occupying the four other spots.

Plum's total scoring is impressive, but it does not end there. Plum's career average of 25.2 points per game would be good enough for the Pac-12 record.

As if that was not impressive enough, Plum's six 40-point career games are, by far, the most of any player in Conference history, five of those coming this season.

Washington's Kelsey Plum is not short of reaching milestones and breaking records. In addition to scoring 3,000-career points and 300-career threes, she

eclipsed 800 free throws for her career and is nearing the NCAA career record of 907 held by Lorri Bauman of Drake (1981-84). With 888 free throws made in her career, she is just 19 away from tying the all-time record.

The only player in Pac-12 history to make 700 free throws, Plum already claimed the record coming into the season and continues to add to it, nearly 200 free throws ahead of the second-place person on the list (608, Tanja Kostic, OSU, 1993-96).

#### IONESCU RECORDS FOURTH TRIPLE-DOUBLE

It has not taken long for Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu to put her mark in the record books. On Feb. 10 against UCLA, she recorded her fourth triple-double of the season, putting her just one away from breaking the single-season Pac-12 record.

Ionescu is one of just three players in Pac-12 history with multiple-career triple-doubles and is in second place all-time. Stanford's Nicole Powell, who is serving as the Ducks' assistant coach under Kelly Graves, holds the Conference's single-season record with five during the 2001-2002 campaign and posted six during her career, tied for the third-most in NCAA history.

Ionescu is tied for third in NCAA history for triple-doubles in a single season. In a span of 16 days over three games, Oregon freshman Sabrina Ionescu recorded triple-double performances twice from Nov. 27-Dec. 12. Her first triple-double of the season was the first in Oregon history since 1988.

#### TRIPLE-DOUBLES GALORE

So far this season, there have been seven instances of triple-double performances by four players this season, the most triple-doubles in a season in Pac-12 history. Washington's Chantel Osahor, UCLA's Jordin Canada, Oregon State's Sydney Wiese and Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu have each recorded triple-doubles this year, Ionescu leading the way with four. Prior to this season, the most triple-double occurrences in a season in league history was five in 2014.

#### OSAHOR TOPPLES RECORD

Washington's Chantel Osahor had, arguably, one of the best games in Pac-12 history grabbing a Pac-12 single-game record 30 rebounds on Jan. 22 in Pullman, while adding 20 points. The senior became just the 11th player in NCAA history to record a 30-rebound game. She also grabbed her 1,000th-career board, making her just the 20th player in Pac-12 history to reach the milestone.

Osahor broke the single-game record that was recently set by Oregon's Jillian Alleyne, who had a 27-rebound outing in 2012 to set the mark. The 30 rebounds were more than the rest of her team combined (25) and equaled the Cougs' game total.

#### ANIGWE SCORES 1,000TH POINT

California's Kristine Anigwe joined the 1,000th-point club on Jan. 8 to become just the 28th player in Cal history to reach the milestone. Only a sophomore,

Anigwe needed just 47 career games, ranking her in a tie for 20th-fastest all-time in collegiate women's basketball history, which includes AIAW and NCAA. She is also the fastest in Pac-12 history, which dates back to 1986-87. Oregon State's Carol Menken scored her 1,000th point in her career which spanned 1979-81, prior to the start of women's sports in the Pac-12, which ties for the fastest ever in collegiate women's basketball history.

#### BRUINS HOME COURT

UCLA is 14-0 this season at home and has a 29-game home win streak alive, the second-longest active home-winning streak in the nation behind UConn's 62. No other team in the Pac-12 is undefeated at home this season. Washington has the most wins so far at home this season with 16, Oregon State has won 14 on its home floor and Stanford 12.

#### COUGS POST BIG WIN, BUT RECEIVE INJURY NEWS

Washington State posted recorded its biggest win ever, taking down then-No. 9/7 UCLA in Los Angeles then followed up with a win at USC to sweep the LA schools for the first time since 1994-95. In the win against the Bruins, freshman Chantelle Molina had 33 points in the win en route to claiming Pac-12 Freshman of the Week honors. It the most points scored by a player against the Bruins in 14 years.

That success came despite playing without key starters Louise Brown and Borislava Hristova. However, since then, the Cougs have received more injury setbacks. Molina suffered an ACL tear injury at Arizona State the following week on Jan. 13, as well as a head injury suffered to Cameron Fernandez. It has been announced that Molina will be out for the season while Fernandez is out indefinitely.

#### TOP DAWGS

Washington Huskies Kelsey Plum and Chantel Osahor have been leading the nation in scoring and rebounding for most of the season. Plum is averaging a nation's best 31.6 points per game, while Osahor is grabbing 14.9 rebounds per game.

Oregon's Lexi Bando has also posted a stellar season behind the three-point arc. She leads the country with an impressive 50.0 shooting rate from long distance.

#### ANIGWE TIES SINGLE-GAME SCORING RECORD

California's Kristine Anigwe, last year's USBWA National Freshman of the Year, netted 50 points to tie the Pac-12's all-time single-game scoring record on Dec. 8 against Sacramento State, making her only the second player in Conference history to score 50 points. Anigwe was 19-for-23 from the floor in that game, also going 12-for-19 from the free throw line.

The original record was set nearly 28 years ago on March 10, 1989 by USC's Cherie Nelson against the Golden Bears. Since then, the record was only

The 50-point outing is also the highest-scoring individual game in the NCAA this season.

Washington's Kelsey Plum's and Oregon State's Sydney Wiese's impact on their respective programs can be seen in the NCAA's active career leaders list.

Plum leads all active players in career points, at over 3,000 points for her career (800 in front of the second-place active leader), and is also the active leader in free throws made at over 800 (300 ahead of the second-place active leader). Plum does not just get to the free throw line, but also makes them with the best percentage from the line among active leaders at 88.0. She also has the most field goals made and attempted, and free throws attempted among the active leaders, and her career-scoring average ties for the best.

Two of the top-eight career active leaders in three-point percentage are from the Pac-12 with Oregon's Lexi Bando leading the way (46.3), followed by Stanford's Karlie Samuelson (43.7) in fourth and Wiese in eighth (42.0).

UCLA's Jordin Canada's career assists average is also in the top five among the active players, as are UW's Chantel Osahor's rebounding numbers, putting her at over 1,000 in total.

Pac-12 teams recorded six keys non-conference wins this season. Most recently, California upset then-No. 20/21 Oklahoma in Las Vegas. Arizona State defeated then-No. 19/23 Florida to claim the ASU Classic title on Dec. 4. The Sun Devils overcame a 12-point, fourth-quarter deficit to win the game. Earlier that same week on Nov. 30, USC upset then-No. 25/19 Texas A&M in College Station. Over the Thanksgiving week, Oregon defeated then-No. 24/19 Michigan State by 33 points on Nov. 22, three days after Colorado took down then-No. 15/19 Kentucky at home. ASU has another big win, defeat-No. 15/18 Kentucky in Lexington. The Sun Devils took a late lead in the fourth quarter then needed overtime to clinch the win.

With six players standing 6-foot-3 or taller, OREGON is tied with Kansas State and Texas for the tallest roster in Division I women's basketball this season. Oregon's tallest player is 6-foot-6 freshman forward Lydia Giomi from West Seattle, Wash., the tallest player on the Oregon roster in 10 years (Jessie Shettters, 6-foot-6. 2003-07).

In the Pac-12, the next tallest teams are CALIFORNIA, STANFORD and USC, each with five players standing at 6-3 and taller. The tallest player in the Conference is ARIZONA's Eugenie Simonet-Keller, a center from France who

The Pac-12 is coming off a historic campaign that saw two teams advance to the NCAA Women's Final Four for the first time in the history of the Conference. OREGON STATE and WASHINGTON made their first-ever trips to the national semifinal last season. It followed historic rounds that included three Elite Eight teams and four Sweet Sixteen teams, both first-time accomplishments for the league. Owning the No. 1 Conference RPI in the country for the majority of the season, Pac-12 teams went 5-0 in the first round after receiving five NCAA Tournament bids for the second-straight season. Conference teams won 14 NCAA Tournament games last season, a league record.

Seven of the 15 All-Pac-12 honorees return this season, including the Conference's leading scorer and All-American Washington's Kelsey Plum. Also back is three-time all-Conference honoree Sydney Wiese of Oregon State who is looking to earn her fourth-straight honor. California's Kristine Anigwe was voted all-league after an impressive rookie campaign. She went on to be selected the USBWA's National Freshman of the Year.

Also back from last year's All-Pac-12 team are Arizona State's Sophie Brunner, UCLA's Jordin Canada, Stanford's Erica McCall and Utah's Emily Potter.

The 2016-17 campaign welcomes two new faces. A new but familiar face will be roaming the sidelines in Tucson. Taking over the Arizona helm is former Wildcat great Adia Barnes. Barnes is familiar with the Conference, not just as a player, but spending last season as an assistant coach at Washington, helping the team reach the program's first-ever NCAA Final Four.

New to the league is Colorado's JR Payne. Payne arrives in Boulder after spending two seasons at Santa Clara and five at Southern Utah before that. Her first coaching position was an assistant coach to now current Oregon head coach Kelly Graves.

Teams across the country will be focused on getting to Dallas this season, the site of the 2017 NCAA Women's Final Four. To get to Dallas, teams will have to go through regional sites at Lexington, Ky., Oklahoma City, Okla., Bridgeport, Conn., and Stockton, Calif. The first and second round of the tournament will take place on 16 campus sites with the top-16 seeds hosting.

## PAC-12 ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS (COACHES VOTE)

### PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE YEAR - KELSEY PLUM, WASHINGTON

Senior Kelsey Plum (Poway, Calif.) has put together a historic season, leading to a Pac-12 Player of the Year nod, and joining Giuliana Mendiola (2003) as the second Husky all-time to earn the honor. Plum has captured the nation in her pursuit of the NCAA all-time scoring record which she broke on Saturday, Feb. 25. That record had stood for 16 years. On Saturday, Plum also broke the Pac-12 record for most points scored in a season, as well as breaking the Conference's single-game mark, netting 57 points in the game. She is just the 12th player in NCAA history to score 3,000 points, and the only player in Pac-12 men's and women's basketball history to reach the milestone. A national player of the year candidate, she is on the watch lists for the Wade Trophy, Naismith Award and John Wooden Award. She has been named the national player of the week twice. Plum is averaging a nation's leading 31.6 points per game, which is on pace to break the Pac-12 single-season record. On the season, she is shooting 53 percent from the field, 44 percent from three-point distance and 89 percent from the free throw line, where she also holds the career record for most made and attempted, while approaching the NCAA record for most free throws made. Plum has led the No. 11 Huskies to a tie for second in the Pac-12 and a No. 3 seed in the Pac-12 Tournament, the team's best finish since 2002.

### PAC-12 FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR - SABRINA IONESCU, OREGON

A guard from Walnut Creek, Calif., Sabrina Ionescu is the first Oregon Duck to be named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year since 1999 (Shaquala Williams) and is the second Duck to earn the honor all-time. Ionescu has recorded four triple-doubles this season, which is one shy of the Pac-12 record and two less than the NCAA record. She is averaging 13.9 points per game which ranks 12th in the Conference and 10th in rebounding (6.8 rebounds per game), while also averaging 5.65 assists per game, the third-best average in the league. She has been named Pac-12 Freshman of the Week four times this season and was named USBWA National Player of the Week on Feb. 14. Along with her teammate Ruthy Hebard, they are the only two freshman to be named to the All-Pac-12 team this year.

### PAC-12 DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR - GABRIELLA HANSON, OREGON STATE

Senior guard Gabriella Hanson (Anaheim, Calif.) is the third-straight OSU Beaver to win the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year award after former teammate Ruth Hamblin claimed the honor the previous two years. Hanson ranks 13th in the Pac-12 in steals per game, averaging 1.40 thefts per game. With her leadership, the Beavs have one of the best defenses in the nation, ranking seventh in the country in in field goal percentage defense (34.4) and 11th in scoring defense (54.5 ppg). Oregon State also ranks fourth in the country in rebounding margin (+11.2 rpg), contributing 4.2 rpg. Hanson has started in all 30 games this season, averaging 6.5 ppg. She helped sixth-ranked Oregon State win its third-consecutive Pac-12 regular-season crown and third-straight No. 1 seed in the Pac-12 Tournament.

### JOHN R. WOODEN PAC-12 COACH OF THE YEAR - SCOTT RUECK, OREGON STATE

Oregon State head coach Scott Rueck wins the John R. Wooden Pac-12 Coach of the Year honor for the second time in three years, also becoming just the fourth coach in Pac-12 history to win the honor multiple times. Rueck has led the Beavers to their third-straight Pac-12 regular-season title and a third-straight No. 1 seed in the Pac-12 Tournament. Oregon State goes into the Pac-12 Tournament ranked sixth in the country in the Associated Press poll after starting the season ranked No. 25. Two of his players were named to the All-Pac-12 team, including Sydney Wiese, who has been listed on several watch lists for prestigious national awards, including the Wade Trophy, Naismith Award and Wooden Award.
