FOUR TOP-25 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL CLASHES HIGHLIGHTS PAC-12 SLATE

For just the third time in league history, six Pac-12 women's basketball teams are ranked in the *USA Today*/WBCA Coaches poll after USC makes its first appearance this week since Nov. 15, 2011. The Trojans are one of just 17 undefeated teams still remaining in the country, which also includes CALIFORNIA and UTAH ... OREGON and STANFORD lead the way for the Conference, both in the top 10 of the coaches and *Associated Press* polls, coming in at No. 7/7 and No. 8/9, respectively. OREGON STATE is No. 11/11, Cal is No. 14/13 and ARIZONA STATE is No. 17/20 ... Three of the four AP top-25 matchups in the country this week feature Pac-12 teams, including a pair of top-10 showdowns on Tuesday. The Cardinal travel to No. 9/8 Tennessee (SEC Network) while the Ducks host No. 4/4 Mississippi State (ESPN2). The Bears host No. 1 Connecticut on Saturday, Dec. 22 on Pac-12 Network ... The Trojans, who are ranked in the WBCA poll, travel to face MSU on Wednesday ... Most Pac-12 teams will use this week's games as the final tune-up before league play begins on Sunday, Dec. 30 ... Stanford's Alanna Smith was tabbed the Pac-12 Player of the Week, as well as the National Player of the Week by ESPNW and USBWA. The senior forward led the Cardinal to an upset of then-No. 3 Baylor, moving it back into the top 10 this week ... The Utes' Dre'Una Edwards recorded her fourth double-double of the season to earn the Pac-12 Freshman of the Week nod for the third time ... ARIZONA is riding an eight-game win streak, the program's longest in 15 years. The Wildcats have already surpassed their win total from all of last season just 10 games into 2018-19 ... Cal's Kristine Anigwe is just six rebounds away from becoming just the 11th player in Pac-12/10 history to record 2,000 points and 1,000 rebounds, and is also set to become the 23rd with 1,000 boards.

After a record-setting six years in Seattle, the 18th-annual Pac-12 Women's Basketball Tournament presented by New York Life heads to Las Vegas for two years. The tournament will be held at the MGM Grand Garden Arena in 2018 from March 7-10, 2019 and will receive unprecedented television coverage once again as each game of the tournament is scheduled to be televised either on the Pac-12 Networks or ESPN2.

The tournament made its debut in 2002 and has been held annual since. The University of Oregon campus played host the first season. The Conference's premier women's sporting event then moved to HP Pavilion in San Jose for a six-year run (2003-08). It spent four years (2008-2012) in Los Angeles, with Galen Center playing host. The final two-year run of the event saw it combined with the men's tournament and the semifinal and championship games were played at the STAPLES Center. The tournament then moved to Seattle's KeyArena for six years where it saw record attendance numbers each year.

The winner of the 12-team tournament receives the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship. The tournament seeds and Conference Champion are determined by the 18-game regular-season Pac-12 schedule.

CONFERENCE NOTEBOOK

ANIGWE APPROACHES MILESTONES

California's Kristine Anigwe eclipsed the 2,000 career-point mark to become only the 20th player in Pac-12/10 history to reach the milestone. She now has her sights set on 1,000-rebounds, needing just six more to reach the threshold. Only 22 players have grabbed 1,000 boards in league history. The All-America candidate is also looking to become just the 11th player in league history to collect 2,000 points and grab 1,000 rebounds.

SIX PAC-12 TEAMS RANKED IN THE COACHES POLL

For just the third time in league history and second time in two years, six Pac-12 teams are ranked in the USA Today/WBCA Coaches poll. The last time six teams were in the national coaches poll was the pre-season ranking released prior to the 2017-18 and 2006-07 campaigns.

PAC-12 SCORING IS UP

As a collective group as of Dec. 18, the Pac-12 boasts the best scoring average among all conferences at 75.00 points per game. It is also posting the best collective field goal percentage (45.34) and 3-point field goal percentage (34.76) of all leagues. Compared to 2017-18, the Conference's numbers are up in each of those categories though, admittedly, though it is early in the season. Its scoring average is up the most dramatically, recording 6.0 ppg better than a year ago when it average 69.00 ppg for seventh-best among the leagues. In 2017-18, Pac-12 teams were shooting 42.95 pct. (3rd) and 33.77 pct. from long range (4th). The Conference's 71.28 shooting from the charity stripe ranks fourth this week among all conferences, but is a slight improvement from last season's 71.16 free throw shooting (9th).

EARLY BRACKETOLOGY

In ESPNW's first bracket projection of the season, Charlie Creme has five teams seeded in the top 16 with California (No. 3 seed), Arizona State (No. 4), Oregon (No. 1 seed), Oregon State (No. 2) and Stanford (No. 3). The Pac-12 is the second-rated league in RPI (behind the ACC, which has four teams among the top 16). Creme has seven total Pac-12 teams in the NCAA Tournament based on performances through Dec. 2, with Colorado and USC in the projected field.

NCAA STATISTICAL LEADERS

Cal's Kristine Anigwe is getting off to a strong start in her senior campaign. She has posted a double-double in each of her team's games so far, tying for the national lead in the category (9, as of Dec. 18). Her 24.6 points per game and 13.7 rebounds per game rank fourth and second, respectively.

Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu leads the nation with a pair of triple-doubles, already owning the NCAA's career mark. Her 8.2 assists average (3rd) leads five league distributors among the top 25. Colorado's Kennedy Leonard ranks six (7.3) and Utah's Dru Gylten is seventh (6.8). Gylten has the best average among all freshmen in the country. Six from the Pac-12 are also among the top 25 in assist-to-turnover ratio with ARIZONA STATE's Reili Richardson ranking third (4.23).

USC freshman Shalexus Aaron continues to lead the nation with a blistering 64.5 three-point shooting percentage with Ionescu not far behind, ranking third with a 55.8 three-point shooting. Arizona's Aari McDonald has been in the top three in scoring all season, and ranked third with a 24.6 ppg average.

Three Pac-12 teams are among the 17 in the country that are still undefeated, including Cal, Utah and USC. With Ionescu leading the way, Oregon has the best scoring average (92.4 ppg), free throw percentage (84.5) and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.93) in the country. All stats are as of Dec. 18.

IONESCU OWNS TRIPLE-DOUBLE RECORDS

With her 12th triple-double on Nov. 18 against Buffalo, Oregon junior Sabrina Ionescu tied the NCAA men's career record held by Kyle Collinsworth of BYU. She was already the NCAA's women's record holder heading into the season, wasting no time adding to her total by logging her first triple-double in the season opener at Alaska Fairbanks. SISTER ACTS

With :38 seconds remaining in the first quarter vs. Saint Mary's on Nov. 11, Washington State's three Molina sisters - Chanelle, Celena, and Cherilyn - appeared on the court together for the first time. The three sisters played 1:21 together on the floor. They are the only trio of active sisters in the Power 5 conferences.

Other sister acts in the Pac-12 include the Moore duo, Minyon and Mariya. The Trojans' Desiree Caldwell older sister Reece is a member of the California Golden Bears and is pursuing a master's degree in public health. The Sabally sisters also wear the same colored jersey in Eugene. Older sister Satou was the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year last season but younger sister freshman Nyara will sit out this season because of an injury.

PRESEASON RANKGS

For the third-straight year and just the fourth time ever, the Pac-12 had five teams ranked in the preseason Associated Press poll, including three in the top 10 for the first time ever. It was the most of any league in the country in the top 10.

Also for the first time ever, the Pac-12 had three teams in the top 10 of the WBCA Coaches poll and four total teams ranked. For a week-by-week listing of team rankings, go to page 2.

HISTORIC CAMPAIGNS

Pac-12 women's basketball is in the midst of its most successful run, coming off a fifth-straight season with

at least five NCAA Tournament bids. Since 2015-16, the Conference boasts the most NCAA Tournament wins (41) of any league and the best winning percentage among peer conferences (.695), posting double-digit NCAA Tournament victories in each of the last three seasons. The Pac-12 is the only conference to have at least two teams in the Elite Eight the last three years, placing at least four in the Sweet 16 during that time. Four Pac-12 teams appeared in the final Associated Press poll, the fourth- straight year the Conference had at least that many teams in the final ranking.

ALL-STAR RETURNS

Ten of the 15 All-Pac-12 honorees return this season, including national award winners at their respective positions Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu (Nancy Lieberman Award winner) and Ruthy Hebard (Katrina McClain Award winner). Cal's Kristine Anigwe was a three-time All-Pac-12 honoree, with Colorado's Kennedy Leonard also earning a spot on the team the last two seasons. Also returning are UO's Maite Cazorla, Washington State's Borislava Hristova, Utah's Megan Huff, Arizona State's Kianna Ibis, Washington's Amber Melgoza and Stanford's Alanna Smith.

In addition, three former national freshmen of the year dot the Pac-12 rosters. Anigwe and Ionescu both were honored with the award by the USBWA in 2016 and 2017, respectively. Redshirt sophomore Destiny Slocum was bestowed the honor by the WBCA in 2017 before transferring to Oregon State.

NEW FACES & FAMILIAR FACES

The Pac-12 welcomes a new face to the sidelines as Kamie Ethridge takes over the Washington State bench. Ethridge is one of the legendary figures in women's basketball, earning a place in the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame. Prior to arriving in Pullman, she spent four seasons at Northern Colorado, leading the team to the NCAA Tournament. The other 11 coaches return for the 2018-19 campaign.

The other 11 coaches return for 2018-19, including Hall of Fame head coach Tara VanDerveer who is in her 33rd season at Stanford and is serving her 40th season as a head coach over three stops. The second-most tenured

head coach in the Pac-12 is Arizona State's Charli Turner Thorne who is in her 22nd season with the Sun Devils. She is a graduate of Stanford where she was a guard for VanDerveer for three years. The other Pac-12 head coaches have been at their respective institutions for single-digit seasons. Oregon State's Scott Rueck is one shy of the 10-year mark.

ROAD TO TAMPA

Teams across the country will be focused on getting to Tampa this season, the site of the 2019 NCAA Women's Final Four on April 5 and 7. To get to Tampa, Fla., teams will have to go through regional sites in Albany, N.Y., Chicago, Greensboro, N.C., and Portland, Ore., where the Oregon State Beavers are hosts. Regional play takes place from March 29-April 1, with specific dates to be announced. The first and second round of the tournament will take place on 16 campus sites with the top-16 seeds hosting, March 22-25, 2019. The top 64 teams will learn their fates in the broadcast of the annual selection show on Monday, March 18, 2019.
