## PAC-12 FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME



**USC vs. STANFORD**

**Preview:** There are a record 10 bowl eligible teams from the Pac-12, but there are only two that will compete for the Pac-12 Championship as the North Division champion STANFORD Cardinal (10-2, 8-1 Pac-12 North) will take on the USC Trojans (8-4, 6-3 Pac-12 South) in the fifth annual Pac-12 Football Championship Game. The Trojans and Utah tied for the South title, but USC won the tiebreaker based on its win over the Utes earlier this season. USC looks to avenge a Conference season-opening loss to the Cardinal (41-31, Sept. 19 at USC), while the Cardinal look to strengthen their case for a spot in the top four of the CFP.

**Television:** ESPN will televise the Pac-12 Football Championship Game with Brad Nessler (pxp), Todd Blackledge (analyst) and Holly Rowe (sideline) calling the action.

**ESPN Radio:** Calling the action will be Adam Amin (pxp), David Norrie (analyst) and Olivia Harlan (sideline).

**Last Meeting:** The two teams opened the 2015 Pac-12 season back on Sept. 19 in Los Angeles as Stanford prevailed, 41-31. Stanford quarterback Kevin Hogan completed 18-of-23 for 279 yards and two touchdowns, while Remound Wright rushed for three more scores. Christian McCaffrey rushed 26 times for 115 yards, added 37 receiving yards and 97 on kick returns for 249 all-purpose yards. USC's Cody Kessler was 25-of-32 for 272 yards and three touchdowns as he connected with JuJu Smith-Schuster eight times for 153 yards and one score.

**Series Record:** USC leads 60\*-30-3 (not including one win later vacated due to NCAA penalty). The first meeting took place in 1905, a 16-0 USC victory, but it's been the recent meetings that has elevated this series. The last six games have been decided by 10 points or less, with the Cardinal prevailing in four of the last six meetings, including a triple overtime thriller in 2011. In fact, the Cardinal have won six of the last nine games.

The Pac-12 posted has posted a winning record outside league for 30 consecutive seasons ... The Pac-12 recorded a 37-9 record in non-conference action last season, posting the most wins ever outside of conference play. Since 1934, only one other season witnessed the Conference capture more than 29 wins in non-league play - 2002 (32-15) when the league played an eight game conference schedule, allowing an additional 10 non-conference games to be played.



## AROUND THE PAC-12

**BOWL ELIGIBLE:** The Pac-12 has a record 10 bowl eligible teams in ARIZONA, ARIZONA STATE, CALIFORNIA, OREGON, STANFORD, UCLA, USC, UTAH, WASHINGTON and WASHINGTON STATE. The Golden Bears are bowl eligible for the first time since 2011. The Cougars are bowl eligible for the first time since 2013 and just the second time since 2003. In terms of percentage of membership achieving bowl eligibility, the Pac-12 leads all other conferences:

**BOWL LINEUP:** The Pac-12 is contracted with seven bowl games. The selection orders is as follows: The Rose Bowl Game will get the Pac-12 Champion, unless that team moves up as one of the four teams in the CFP semifinals. If that is the case, the Rose Bowl will replace the champion with another Pac-12 team. Once the Rose Bowl is filled, the Alamo, Holiday and Foster Farms Bowls will pick in order from teams with a one-game differential in the Conference standings. The Sun, Las Vegas and Cactus Bowls will then select the teams in order of finish in the Conference standings.

**ROAD WARRIORS:** After posting perfect 5-0 record in the final week of the regular season, the home teams finally overtook the visitors with a 29-25 record in Conference play.

**POLL WATCHING:** The polls have been a revolving door for Pac-12 teams. After a one week absence, both USC and UTAH moves back into the AP poll this week, joining STANFORD and OREGON ... Five different Pac-12 teams this season have been ranked in the AP Top 10 ... Over the last two seasons, 10 different Pac-12 teams have been ranked among the AP Top 25, while six different Conference teams have been ranked among the Top 10.

**ALL-PURPOSE:** STANFORD sophomore RB **Christian McCaffrey** continues to lead the FBS with 252.92 all-purpose yards per game, more than 50 yards over the next player (Tyler Ervin, San Jose State, 200.83 ypg). He set a Pac-12 record with 3,035 all-purpose yards and is the third player in FBS history to post 3,000 or more yards, joining Oklahoma State's Barry Sanders (3,250 yards in 1988) and Western Kentucky's Antonio Andrews (3,161 yards in 2012) ... His school-record 389 all-purpose yards posted against California is the top mark in the FBS this season ... McCaffrey has rushed for 100 or more yards in nine games. His 3,035 all-purpose yardage breakdown is as follows: 1,640 rushing, 435 receiving, 922 kick return, 38 punt return ... Since 1978, only four other Conference players have averaged 200 or more all-purpose yards per game for an entire season - USC's Marcus Allen in 1981 (232.6 avg), Stanford's Glyn Milburn in 1990 (202.0 avg), USC's Reggie Bush in 2005 (222.3 avg) and USC's Marqise Lee in 2012 (206.4 avg). Coincidentally, Milburn's teammate in 1990 was Ed McCaffrey (father of Christian), who had 61 receptions for 917 yards and a Conference-leading 91.7 receiving yards per game that season ... In addition to McCaffrey, the Pac-12 boasts OREGON's **Royce Freeman** (7th, 169.25 ypg) and UTAH's **Devontae Booker** (8th, 157.90 ypg) among the FBS all-purpose leaders.

**YOUTH WILL BE SERVED:** Underclassmen were making their mark in the Pac-12 this season. Take a look at the league statistics and you'll see sophomores leading in several categories - Rushing (1. **Royce Freeman**, ORE, 142.2 avg; 2. **Christian McCaffrey**, STAN 136.7 avg); Passing (1. **Luke Falk**, WSU, 387.8 ypg); Receiving Yards/Game (1. **JuJu Smith-Schuster**, USC, 108.5 avg); Total Offense (1. **Luke Falk**, WSU, 377.5 avg); Scoring (1. **Aidan Schneider**, ORE, 10.2 ppg); Scoring TDs (1. **Royce Freeman**, ORE, 16 TDs); Punt Return Avg (1. **Dante Pettis**, WASH, 16.9 avg); Kick Return Avg (1. **Christian McCaffrey**, STAN, 29.7 avg); All-Purpose (1. **Christian McCaffrey**, STAN, 252.9 avg; 2. **Royce Freeman**, ORE, 169.2 avg) ... While they might not be leading any statistical category, several freshmen had standout performances this year. UCLA quarterback **Josh Rosen** threw for a UCLA freshmen record 3,350 yards and 20 TDs, WASHINGTON trotted out a freshman QB in **Jake Browning** and a freshman RB in **Myles Gaskin**. Browning threw for a Washington freshman record 2,671 yards and 16 TDs, while Gaskin rolled up a Husky freshman record 1,121 rushing yards and 10 TDs ... Defensively, USC freshman LB **Cameron Smith** led the Trojans with 78 tackles (7.8 avg) before a season-ending injury. ARIZONA STATE freshman DB **Kareem Orr** recorded a league-best five interceptions.

**AIR PAC-12:** WASHINGTON STATE's **Luke Falk** and CALIFORNIA's **Jared Goff** become the eighth and ninth players in Pac-12 history to throw for more than 4,000 yards. For the third time in the last five seasons, two quarterbacks have thrown for more than 4,000 yards in the same season.

## STANFORD

**STANFORD:** It's the third FCG appearance in four years for the Cardinal ... Since 2010, Stanford is 45-6 in games played in California (7-1 in 2015, 7-2 in 2014, 7-2 in 2013, 10-0 in 2012, 7-1 in 2011, 7-0 in 2010). Two of those losses came at the hands of USC (2013, 2014) ... Stanford is 22-2 this decade against Golden State opponents ... Senior QB **Kevin Hogan** is 34-10 as a starter, 14-6 vs. AP top 25 teams. The 34 wins are most among active QBs. He became the fourth Cardinal to throw for over 9,000 yards in a career, joining Steve Stenstrom, Andrew Luck and John Elway ... Sophomore RB **Christian McCaffrey** has posted several school records this season, including 243 yards rushing (vs. UCLA) and 389 all-purpose yards (vs. California) ... Only team in the Pac-12 to start the same starting five on the offensive line for every game this season ... Senior LB **Blake Martinez** leads the Pac-12 and is 14th nationally at 10.1 tackles per game. With 121 tackles, it's his second-straight 100-tackle seasons, the first Cardinal to accomplish the feat in 27 seasons ... Coach **David Shaw** has led Stanford to four 10-win seasons over the last five years ... The Cardinal has scored a nation-leading 30+ points in 11-consecutive games.

## USC

**USC:** The Trojans are playing in their first Pac-12 Football Championship Game, and doing so under Clay Helton. Helton was named USC's head coach after serving as interim head coach for the final seven regular season games. Under Helton, the Trojans have outrushed opponents in each game (by an average of 263 to 124 yards) and been +9 in turnovers (14 to 5) ... Freshman TB **Ronald Jones II** set a USC freshman season rushing record previously held by Heisman winner Charles White in 1976. He's eighth in the Pac-12 in rushing (890 yards, 74.2 ypg) ... Sophomore WR **JuJu Smith-Schuster** leads the Pac-12, and is seventh in the FBS in receiving with 108.5 yards/game ... Sophomore CB-WR-RET **Adoree' Jackson** (the only player in the country with 300 yards receiving, 500 yards in kick runbacks, 200 punt return yards and 20 tackles) has scored TDs via punt return in back-to-back games ... Unitas and Senior CLASS Award finalist senior QB **Cody Kessler** is in USC's all-time Top 4 in TD passes (3rd, 86), completions (3rd, 811), passing yards (4th, 10,151) and total offense (4th, 9,758) (and above Matt Leinart's school career records for completion percentage, 68.0%, and interception rate, 1.85%).

## AROUND THE PAC-12

**ARIZONA:** The Wildcats are bowl eligible for the a school-best fourth straight season ... With junior WR **Trey Griffey** posting two catches for 138 yards, Arizona has now had five different receivers post 100 or more yards receiving in a game this season, most among the Pac-12 ... Griffey's 95-yard TD reception at Arizona State is the third longest scoring play in UA history ... Senior PK **Casey Skowron** was a perfect 3-for-3 on field goal attempts in each of the last three games. He's hit on 10 straight field goal attempts (UA record is 11 by Max Zendejas in 1984) and 16 of his last 17 attempts

**ARIZONA STATE:** The Sun Devils are bowl eligible for the fourth consecutive season ... Over the last two games, senior WR **Devin Lucien** has 17 receptions for 390 yards and 4 TDs ... Senior WR **D.J. Foster's** Pac-12 record of consecutive games with a reception now sits at 52, the longest active streak in the FBS ... Junior PK **Zane Gonzalez** tallied 22 points in the loss at California, including a perfect 6-of-6 on his field goal attempts. He as 368 career points and only trails Luis Zendejas (380 points) for most in school history.

**CALIFORNIA:** Finished the regular season at 7-5 overall and 4-5 in Conference play. Its 5-1 home record is the best mark since 2008 and gave Cal its first winning season since 2011 ... Junior QB Jared Goff increased his school record to 11,733 career passing yards and set the Golden Bear career record for TD passes at 90. That mark ties for fourth-all time in Pac-12 history. Goff closed out the regular season with a school single-game record 542 yards and five TDs, becoming the ninth Conference quarterback to tally more than 4,000 yards in a single season. The Golden Bears set team single-season records in passing yardage (4,425), passing TDs (38) and total offense (6,293).

**COLORADO:** Senior WR **Nelson Spruce** completed his CU career with a Pac-12 record 294 receptions (16th all-time in FBS) for a CU record 3,347 receiving yards (8th all-time in the Pac-12). In his final game, he broke the school's career record for TD receptions with 23 ... More Spruce: With 1,053 receiving yards this season, he became the third player in CU history with a pair of 1,000-yard receiving seasons. He caught at least one pass in 38 straight games, multiple receptions in 33 straight ... 23 different Buffaloes have made their first career starts in 2015.

**OREGON:** Sophomore RB **Royce Freeman** set the Oregon school record with eight-straight 100-yard rushing games. He finished the season as the only FBS player to eclipse 100 scrimmage yards in every one of this team's games this season. He sits fifth on the Ducks' single-season rushing list with 1,706 yards, 99 yards shy of the record 1,805 rushing yards set by LaMichael James in 2011 ... Over the last three games, senior QB **Vernon Adams Jr.** was a combined 58-of-75 for 978 yards and 11 TDs with one interception. Against Pac-12 opponents (10 games), Adams had 35 TD passes with just four interceptions ... The Ducks have an active streak of 80-straight games with a passing TD, extending their own NCAA record.

**OREGON STATE:** Freshman RB **Ryan Nall** rushed for a career-high 174 yards on 19 carries (9.2 avg) and amassed 228 all-purpose yards in the 52-42 loss at Oregon. The Beavers outscored the Ducks 35-21 in the second half, established a season-high in points (42) and season-best numbers in rushing yards (228) and total offense (427 yards) in Pac-12 games ... Senior RB **Storm Barrs-Woods** finished his career as just the second running back in school history with 2,000 yards rushing (2,674) and 1,000 yards receiving (1,079) ... The Beavers started three different freshmen at quarterback this season - Seth Collins, Nick Mitchell and Marcus McMaryion.

**UCLA:** Over the final six games of the regular season, senior WR **Jordan Payton** (44 rec. - 582 yards) and junior TE **Thomas Duarte** (26 rec. - 472 yards) have combined for 70 catches and 1,054 yards ... Payton has established a school record for career receptions (198), while his 75 catches on the season ranks third on the all-time single-season list (record is 82 by J.J. Stokes in 1993) and 1,068 receiving yards in 2015 is sixth on that list ... Freshman QB **Josh Rosen** set a school record for most passing attempts without an interception with 246 pass attempts before being picked off at USC last week ... Senior PK **Kai'mi Fairbairn's** Pac-12 career scoring record now stands at 410 points.

**UTAH:** Junior RB **Joe Williams** started in place of the injured **Devontae Booker** the last two games and has rushed for 308 yards on 57 carries (5.4 avg) ... Senior P **Tom Hackett** leads the Pac-12, and is third in the FBS, averaging 47.8 yards per punt. His 45.07 career average is currently the best in Pac-12 history ... Junior PK **Andy Phillips** added to his Utah school record for career field goals made, now with 63. His eight points against Colorado give him a Utah career record 316 points.

**WASHINGTON:** With their win over Washington State, the Huskies become the 10th Pac-12 team to become bowl eligible this season ... Washington posted a school-record 28-point first quarter in UW's 52-7 victory over Washington State ... Freshman QB **Jake Browning** completed 18-of-20 for 211 yards and threw four TDs, the second-best single-game completion percentage in school history. Browning has established UW freshman marks for passing yards in a season with 2,468 and TD passes with 20 ... Freshman RB **Myles Gaskin** has rushed for a UW freshman record 1,121 yards, the 11th most in school history.

**WASHINGTON STATE:** Earned its first 8-win season, and first three-game conference win streak, since 2003 ... Junior WR **Gabe Marks** needs one reception to reach 100 for the season - the 10th player in Pac-12 history to record 100 receptions in a season. He's hauled in a WSU single-season record 14 receiving TDs. Currently sixth on WSU's season list with 1,125 receiving yards ... Sophomore QB **Luke Falk** owns the WSU single-season record with 36 TD passes, and is six shy of the Pac-12 record of 42 set by Marcus Mariota last season ... Senior WR Dom Williams holds 30 TD receptions in his career, the second most in school history ... WSU's win over Oregon State gave Mike Leach career win No. 100.

## PAC-12 FOOTBALL HONORS

**Offensive Player of the Year: Christian McCaffrey, RB, Stanford**

**Scholar-Athlete of the Year: Mike Bercovici, QB, Arizona State**

**Offensive Player of the Year – Christian McCaffrey, RB, Stanford:** McCaffrey, a sophomore from Castle Rock, Colo., totaled 3,035 all-purpose yards, a Pac-12 single-season record, and currently leads the nation. The Doak Walker, Maxwell and Walter Camp Player of the Year semifinalist and Hornung finalist led Stanford to wins over No. 4 Notre Dame, No. 18 UCLA and No. 6 USC to earn a berth in the Pac-12 championship game and the third North Division title in the last four years. McCaffrey set several school records this season, including totaling 243 yards rushing on 25 carries against UCLA, recorded nine-consecutive 100-yard rushing performances and amassed 389 all-purpose yards against California, breaking a 25-year-old school record. McCaffrey was selected as the Conference's Player of the Week twice this season, once on offense and once on special teams.

**Pat Tillman Defensive Player of the Year - DeForest Buckner, DE, Oregon:** Buckner, a senior lineman from Waianae, Hawai'i, finished the regular season for the second-straight year as the team leader in tackles for loss. In 2015, he recorded 76 tackles (6.3 avg), including 16.0 TFL for 82 yards and totaled 9.5 sacks, which ties for 13th in the nation. The Ted Hendricks Award and Polynesian College Football Player of the Year semifinalist is tied for ninth in Duck history with 35 tackles for loss.

**Freshman Offensive Player of the Year - Josh Rosen, QB, UCLA:** Rosen, a quarterback from Manhattan Beach, Calif., took over for the Bruins under center as a true freshman. In his first outing, Rosen went 28-of-35 for 351 yards and three touchdowns in the 34-16 win over Virginia and was named Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week and Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week for his performance. He finished the regular season completing 266 passes in 447 attempts (.595) for a UCLA freshman record 3,350 yards and 20 touchdowns. The rookie went on to set a Bruin record with 246 pass attempts without an interception.

**Freshman Defensive Player of the Year - Cameron Smith, LB, USC:** Smith, a freshman from Roseville, Calif., helped the Trojans to an 8-4 overall record, a share of the Pac-12 South title and a berth to the Pac-12 Championship Game. Smith was the first USC freshman to start at middle linebacker since 1978. He started nine of 10 games and finished his rookie season with a team-leading 78 tackles as well as three interceptions. Smith became the first USC player to intercept three passes in a game since 1991, picking off three passes in the win over then-No. 3 Utah and was named Conference Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts. Smith was one of six USC true freshmen to score a touchdown this season. Smith now becomes the fourth Trojan in the last five years to be named Freshman Defensive Player of the Year.

**Co-Coach of the Year – Mike Leach, Washington State:** In his fourth year at the helm of the Cougar program, Leach led WSU to a 8-4 record and a 6-3 mark in Pac-12 play after being picked to finish fifth in the Pac-12 North in the preseason. WSU led the country in passing offense at 397.0 and recorded its first three-game conference-winning streak since 2003. The Cougars appeared at No. 20 in the AP and Coaches polls, its highest ranking since 2003. Under Leach's tutelage, Washington State at 8-4 is bowl eligible for just the second time since 2003. The Cougars' win over Oregon State gave Leach his 100th-career win.

**Co-Coach of the Year – David Shaw, Stanford:** In his fifth year as the Stanford Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football, Shaw led the Cardinal to a 10-2 record and an 8-1 mark in Conference play and his fourth 10+ win season. Shaw guided the Cardinal to its third Pac-12 North title in four years for a berth to the Pac-12 Championship Game. Stanford saw three wins over ranked opponents this year with the help of an offense that averaged 36.9 points behind the Pac-12's most efficient passing game (157.9 passing efficiency) and a rushing attack that's averaged 222.0 yards per game – the third best single-season average in school history. The Cardinal top the FBS in time of possession average at 35.12 minutes per game.

**Scholar-Athlete of the Year – Mike Bercovici, QB, Arizona State:** Bercovici, a redshirt senior from Calabasas, Calif., graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in business management in three years, and maintained a 3.25 grade point average through his undergraduate studies and a 3.67 GPA combined with his graduate-level studies. Bercovici has guided Arizona State to its fifth straight bowl-eligible season and has thrown for 4,915 yards in his career with 38 touchdowns, while rushing for 136 yards and six touchdowns. Off the field, Bercovici is a 10-time Scholar Baller at Arizona State, an ASU honor given to student-athletes who achieve a GPA of 3.0 or above. The two-time Pac-12 All-Academic honorable mention honoree is currently enrolled in a Master's of Sports Law and Business and is on track to graduate in May of 2016. The program combines classes from the Sandra Day O'Connor School of Law and the W.P. Carey School of Business.

The Scholar-Athlete award has been established to honor collegiate student-athletes that are standouts both academically and in their sports discipline.

## PAC-12 BOWL ARRANGEMENTS

The Pac-12 is in the second year of a six-year agreement with seven bowl partners that should provide the Conference with a competitive postseason bowl experience. The lineup is led by the Rose Bowl Game presented by Northwestern Mutual, which is the destination for the Pac-12 champion. In 2015-16, the Cotton Bowl and Orange Bowl are slotted as the College Football Playoff semifinal games. If the Pac-12 champion is ranked among the top four of the College Football Playoff poll following the 2015 season and play in either the Cotton or Orange Bowl, the Pac-12 would back-fill the Rose Bowl game. At its option, the CFP may select another Pac-12 team to participate in one of its games. After the Rose Bowl and/or CFP participants from the Conference have been identified, the Conference has bowl agreements with six additional bowl games which have selection preference in the following order: Alamo Bowl, Holiday Bowl, Foster Farms Bowl, Sun Bowl, Las Vegas Bowl, Cactus Bowl. Based on Conference records, the Alamo, Holiday and Foster Farms Bowls will select from teams with no more than a one-game differential. The Sun, Las Vegas and Cactus will then select teams based on Conference order of finish.

The Conference's storied history dates back 100 years to Dec. 2, 1915 when four schools - the University of California, Oregon Agricultural College (now Oregon State University), the University of Oregon and the University of Washington - gathered at the historic Imperial Hotel in Portland, Ore., to form the Pacific Coast Conference.

Since that day, the Conference has been known for its widespread excellence - on the field, in the classroom, and with the contributions its graduates make in the world. No other Conference can match the collective achievements and distinctions accomplished over the last century.



NETWORK

## PAC-12 FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

The Pac-12 Football Championship Game will take place Saturday, December 5 at 4:45 p.m. PT and telecast to a national audience on ESPN. The Championship game will match the winner of the North Division vs. the winner of the South Division. The game will be played at Levi's® Stadium in Santa Clara, Calif. The champion will eye a spot opposite the Big Ten champion in the Rose Bowl Game. If the Pac-12 champion is in the top four of the College Football Playoff poll following the 2015 season it would vacate its spot in the Rose Bowl to participate in CFP semi-finals in either the Cotton or Sugar Bowl. The Rose Bowl would then fill the vacated spot with another Pac-12 team.

The winner of each Division will be determined by the record in all games played (both divisional and cross-divisional) within the conference. In the event of a tie, the following procedures will be applied to determine the Pac-12 Championship Game representatives

### Two-Team Tie.

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
  - a. If no game is played between the two tied teams or that game ends in a tie, the following tie-breaking procedures would be applied:
2. Record in games played within the division
3. Record against the next highest placed team in the division (Based on record in all games played within the conference), proceeding through the division.
4. Record in common conference games.
5. Highest ranking in the College Football Playoff poll entering the last weekend of regular-season games.
6. Total number of wins in a 12-game season. The following conditions will apply to the calculation of the total number of wins:
  - a. Only one win against a team from the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision or lower division will be counted annually.
  - b. Any games that are exempted from counting against the annual maximum number of football contests per NCAA rules (current Bylaw 17.9.5.2) shall not be included.
7. Coin toss.

### Multiple-Team Ties.

The following procedures will only be used to eliminate all but two teams, at which point the two-team tie-breaking procedure will be applied.

1. Head-to-head (Best record in games among the tied teams).
2. Record in games played within the division.
3. Record against the next highest placed team in the division (based on record in all games played within the conference), proceeding through the division.
4. Record in common conference games.
5. Highest ranking in the College Football Playoff poll entering the last weekend of regular-season games.

### Determination of Home Team in Pac-12 Championship

The home team in the Pac-12 Championship Game will be determined by the record in all games played within the conference. In the event of a tie, the following procedures will be applied to determine the home team.

### Tie-breaking Procedure.

1. Head-to-head, if applicable.
2. Record against the next highest-placed common opponent in the conference (based on record in all games played within the conference), proceeding through the conference.
3. Record in common conference games.
4. Highest ranking in the College Football Playoff poll following the last weekend of Pac-12 regular-season games.
5. Coin toss.
