PAC-12 PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSE

N'Keal Harry, WR, ASU

Harry caught nine passes for 161 yards and a career-high three TDs in ASU's 38-20 upset of No. 16 Utah. Harry had TD receptions of 3, 23, and 61 yards. Seven of his nine receptions were good for a first down and/or touchdown. His Three-yard TD reception in the first quarter put ASU up 14-0. Hauled in a 23-yard TD reception with 1:01 left in the first half that put ASU up 21-17 after Utah had reeled of 17 straight points. Had 61-yard TD reception on the opening play of the fourth quarter that extended ASU's lead to 28-20.

DEFENSE

Merlin Robertson, LB, ASU

Led ASU with nine tackles, including one TFL, and recorded his first career interception in ASU's 38-20 upset of No. 16 Utah. Led a Sun Devil defensive effort that held the Utes, who came in averaging 41 points in their past four games, to only 325 yards for the game and only three points in the second half. After the Utes scored on three straight possessions, Robertson picked up his first career interception on Utah's first possession of the second half.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Ugochukwu Amadi, S/PR, ORE

Gave Oregon a 7-0 lead against UCLA with a 56-yard punt return for a TD in the first quarter, which marked Oregon's first punt return for a TD since 2015 at Michigan State. Averaging 24.1 yards per punt return (8 returns), with four of his eight returns having gone for over 20 yards. He is tied for the national lead with two returns of 50-plus yards. He is the only FBS player in the nation with a punt return TD and a pick-6. Also added three tackles, including one for loss, in the win over UCLA.

PAC-12 FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

THE RANKINGS: Two Pac-12 teams are ranked in the AP poll and three in the Coaches poll. WASHINGTON STATE (10/11) is ranked in the Top 10 for the 30th time in the history of the AP poll, and is joined by WASHINGTON (20/18). UTAH remains in the Coaches poll at No 24.

DIVISION RACES: The Pac-12 North Division comes down to WASHINGTON STATE, WASHINGTON and OREGON. Both the Cougars and the Huskies control their own destiny. Should either team win out, they will represent the North in the Pac-12 Football Championship Game. Oregon needs to win out and finish in a two-team tie with Washington at 6-3, where the Ducks would own the tie-breaker ... The South Division is still up for grabs as all six teams have a chance to represent the South at the Pac-12 Football Championship Game.

HOME, NOT SO SWEET HOME: While Pac-12 teams are 18-3 (.857) at home in non-conference play, they are just 22-16 (.579) on the home turf in league play.

FIVE IN A ROW: During Washington State's five-game winning streak, QB **Gardner Minshew II** is 173-for-248 (.698) for 1,970 yards (394.0 ypg) and 16 TDs ... Minshew has been well protected during the last five games, getting sacked just four times in 248 pass attempts ... Eight different Cougars have caught at least 10 passes over the last five games, while four different players caught at least 20 passes ... During the five-game streak, Minshew's 1,970 passing yards are more than 51 FBS teams have thrown for all season.

TAKING A STAND: WASHINGTON LB **Ben Burr-Kirven** leads all Pac-12 players with 10 or more tackles in a game eight times this season. He has compiled a league-best 134 tackles to date for a 13.4 tackles per game (2nd in the FBS). Here's list of those defensive stalwarts with the most games having double-digit tackles:

THORPE AWARD SEMIFINALISTS: The Paycom Jim Thorpe Award tabs a pair of Pac-12 safeties as semifinalist for the prestigious honor that recognizes the best defensive back in the nations - senior **Ugochukwu Amadi**, ORE and senior **Taylor Rapp**, WASH. Conference players who have earned the award include Mark Carrier, USC (1994); Darryl Lewis, ARIZ (1990); Antoine Cason, ARIZ (2007); Adoreé Jackson, USC (2016). Colorado's Deon Figures (1992) and Chris Hudson (1994) claimed the award, but that was prior to the Buffs joining the Pac-12.

MAXWELL AND BEDNARIK AWARD SEMIFINALISTS: The Pac-12 had several players listed among the semifinalists announced for the 82nd Maxwell Award for the Collegiate Player of the Year and 24th Chuck Bednarik Award for the Outstanding Defensive Player of the Year. Those up for the Maxwell Award include COLORADO WR **Laviska Shenault**, OREGON QB **Justin Herbert**, UTAH RB **Zack Moss** and WASHINGTON STATE QB **Gardner Minshew II**. The Chuck Bednarik Award tabs WASHINGTON CB **Byron Murphy** and LB **Ben Burr-Kirven** as semifinalists.

POLYNESIAN FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME: Four former players from the Pac-10 era are the newest members of the Polynesian Football Hall of Fame Class of 2019. ARIZONA's Joe Salave'a (1994-97), ARIZONA STATE's Dan Saleaumua (1983-86), USC's Lofa Tatupu (2003-04) and WASHINGTON's Marques Tuiasosopo (1997-2000).

AROUND THE PAC-12

UCLA (2-7) at ARIZONA STATE (5-4)
Sat., Nov. 10 • 12:00 pm MT • P12N • #UCLAvsASU

UCLA: RB **Joshua Kelley** registered his fifth 100-yard rushing game of the season with a career-best 161-yard effort at Oregon. Kelley's total of five games is the most by a Bruin back in a season since Paul Perkins also had five 100-yard games in the 2015 season. Kelley also had a career-best six receptions for 32 yards versus Oregon, marking the fifth game this season he has grabbed at least three passes in a game ... UCLA racked up a season-best 496 yards of total offense against the Ducks (199 rush, 297 pass) on a season-high 87 plays. The previous best was 460 yards against Arizona on 82 plays ... DB **Adarius Pickett** finished with 11 tackles to produce the team high for the seventh time this season. It was the fifth double-digit effort of this season and the eighth of his career. He now has 95 tackles in 2018.

ARIZONA STATE: WR **N'Keal Harry** has a catch in all 34 games of his career and has 22 career TD receptions (tied for fifth all-time at ASU) ... Harry posted nine receptions for 161 yards vs. Utah. His 195 career receptions are third all-time at ASU, while his 2,629 receiving yards are sixth ... Harry has at least one TD reception in 10 of last 14 games. He has 14 TD receptions in those 14 games after he had just 8 in the first 20 games of his career ... RB **Eno Benjamin** has rushed for 100 or more yards six times this season as he finished with 175 yards vs. Utah. Benjamin's 1,113 rushing yards this season are the third most in a season by a Sun Devil during the Pac-10/Pac-12 era ... If ASU beats UCLA, it would be the fifth time in 28 tries that the Sun Devils defeated both UCLA and USC in the same season. Two of the previous four occurrences led to Rose Bowl appearances for Arizona State. ... The Sun Devils have five games this year (UTSA, UW, OSU, USC and Utah) without allowing a sack. Since at least 2000, ASU had never had more than two games in a season where it didn't allow a sack.

OREGON STATE (2-7) at STANFORD (5-4)
Sat., Nov. 10 • 6:00 p.m. PT • P12N • #OSUvsSTAN

OREGON STATE: QB **Jake Luton** started the game at quarterback for the first time since week one vs. Ohio State, and connected on his first seven pass attempts of the game. Luton completed 31-of-45 for 301 yards and 1 TD, as he becomes the first Oregon State quarterback with back-to-back 300+ yard games since Sean Mannion did so against California and Washington State in 2014 ... WR **Trevon Bradford** had a career-high 10 receptions for 63 yards. It was his 28th career game with double-digit receptions ... WR **Isaiah Hodgins** added eight receptions for 129 yards, his third 100-yard receiving game this season ... RB **Jemar Jefferson** is the eighth Beaver to gain 1,000 yards rushing in a season. He currently has 1,092 yards on the year and is on pace for 1,456 yards this season, which would be the fifth most in program history ... The Beavers have scored 258 points this season (28.7 ppg) after they scored 248 points (20.7 ppg) all of last season.

STANFORD: It's been a slow start for the Cardinal as they have been outscored 69-28 in the first quarter this season ... For the third time in four games, TE **Kaden Smith** 100 yards receiving as he had eight catches for 107 yards and 1 TD ... **K.J. Costello** completed 29-of-43 passes for 347 yards and two TDs. Costello has thrown at least one scoring pass in 13 straight games ... ILB **Bobby Okereke**, making his 36th straight start, finished with a team-high 11 tackles, his third double digit game this season ... Due to injuries, Stanford has started five offensive line combinations in nine games. Four first-teamers have missed at least one contest and three have missed multiple games.

CALIFORNIA (5-4) at USC (5-4)
Sat., Nov. 10 • 7:30 pm PT • ESPN • #CALvsUSC

CALIFORNIA: Following the 19-13 loss at Washington State, the Golden Bear defense has now allowed a total of 36 points (12.0 ppg) over its past three games. Washington State entered the game averaging 40.8 ppg and 476.2 ypg. The Bears held the Cougars to 19 points (lowest output of the season) and 413 yards of offense ... PK **Greg Thomas** connected on 2-of-3 field goal attempts, both over 40 yards. His first was a 42-yarder in the second quarter and he made a career-long 46-yarder in the third quarter ... LBs **Evan Weaver** and **Jordan Kunaszyk** tied for tackle honors vs. WSU with nine stops apiece. Kunaszyk has 103 tackles and is second in the Pac-12 with 11.4 tackles per game, Weaver has 95 tackles and is tied for third in the league with 10.6 tackles per game.

USC: The Trojans snapped a two-game losing streak with a 38-21 win at Oregon State behind ground attack led by **Aca'Cedric Ware** (17 carries, 205 yards, 3 TDs), **Vavae Malepeai** (15 carries, 101 yards) and **Stephen Carr** (six carries, 49 yards, 1 TD) ... USC put up a season-high 509 total yards (332 rushing/177 passing). The 332 rushing yards are 25 percent of the team's rushing total for the season ... The Trojans posted a season-high six sacks and limited Oregon State to 31 yards rushing. LB **Christian Rector** led the way with nine tackles, 2.5 sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss.

WASHINGTON STATE (8-1) at COLORADO (5-4)
Sat., Nov. 10 • 1:30 pm MT • ESPN • #WSUvsCU

WASHINGTON STATE: WSU improves to 8-1 for the first time since 2002. It has now won eight or more games in a school-best four straight seasons ... QB **Gardner Minshew II** has thrown for 300-plus yards in nine straight games, completing 35-of-51 for 334 yards and 1 TD in the 19-13 win over California ... 11 different players were on the receiving end of a Minshew pass in the game vs. California, led by RB **James Williams** with 10 receptions for 53 yards ... LB Peyton Pelluer had 10 tackles, his fourth game this season with 10 or more tackles. His 325 career tackles rank seventh on the WSU career list. Pelluer played his 50th career game and in his next game will match the school record of 51 games that is shared by Gabe Marks and Daniel Ekualé ... WSU has won 12 straight home games for the first time since 1928-33 (school-record 19 game-winning streak).

COLORADO: QB **Steven Montez** was 27 of 42 for 343 yards and 3 TDs. It was his fifth 300-yard passing game this season, giving him 10 for his career (CU record is 11 by Sefo Liufau). He is tied for third all-time at Colorado with 44 TD passes (with Joel Klatt, 2002-05); Cody Hawkins (2007-10) and Sefo Liufau (2013-16) top the list with 60 each ... With 319 yards of total offense at Arizona, Montez has become the fifth player with 7,000 yards (7,159). It was his sixth 300-yard game this year, the 13th of his career, as he has tied Sefo Liufau for the all-time record in CU history ... WR **Juwann Winfree** had a career-high eight receptions for 101 yards, his second career 100-yard game.

OREGON (6-3) at UTAH (6-3)
Sat., Nov. 10 • 3:30 pm MT • P12N • #UOvsUTAH

OREGON: DB/PR **Ugochukwu Amadi** returned a punt 56 yards for a TD, the first punt return for a TD since Bralon Addison in 2015 at Michigan State ... QB **Justin Herbert** completed 18-of-32 for 264 yards and 2 TDs. He has thrown a TD pass in 24 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the nation ... Herbert has thrown for 1,956 yards with 19 TDs to just two INT in nine career conference road games ... With eight receptions for 156 yard and two scores against UCLA, WR **Dillon Mitchell** now has 50 catches for 735 yards and 5 TDs over the last six games. He has a catch in 14 straight games, and at least six catches in each of the last six games ... LB **Troy Dye** had 10 tackles to reach double-digit tackles for the fifth consecutive game, becoming the first Oregon player to do so since Mark Kearns in 1987 ... Has double-digits in tackles 16 career games, which is tied for the third-most in program history.

UTAH: With 128 rushing yards on 18 carries at Arizona State, RB **Zack Moss**, a semifinalist for the Maxwell Award as the Collegiate Player of the Year, has 1,092 rushing yards this season. He is just the fourth player in program history with two 1,000-yard seasons (he rushed for 1,173 yards in 2017) ... Starting QB **Tyler Huntley** is lost for the season to an injury suffered last week at ASU. Replacing him is redshirt freshman **Jason Shelley**. Huntley finished his junior season 150-of-234 passing (64.1%) for 1,788 yards and 12 touchdowns. He's the seventh player in program history to amass 5,000 career total offense yards (5,115) ... The Utes have sold out 55 straight games in Rice-Eccles Stadium since the 2010 season opener.

OPEN DATE

ARIZONA (5-5): RB **J.J. Taylor** rushed for 192 yards on 40 carries in the win over Colorado. It marked the third straight game Taylor has rushed for at least 150 yards. Taylor is the first Arizona running back to rush for at least 150 yards in three straight games since Ka'Deem Carey in 2013. The 40 rush attempts are the second-most in UA history, trailing the 48 attempts by Ka'Deem Carey vs. Oregon (Nov. 23, 2013) ... QB **Khalil Tate** completed 17-of-22 for a career-high 350 yards and a career-best matching 5 TD passes. He had five completions of 30 or more yards to five different receivers. He's thrown five TD passes in three games in his career, becoming the first Arizona quarterback ever to do that ... WR **Shawn Poindexter** caught two passes for 40 yards and 2 TDs. It's the third straight week Poindexter has had 2 TD catches in a game ... LB **Colin Schooler** finished with nine tackles, including three for a loss. He now has 101 tackles through 10 games, and 19 TFL on the season, which is better than 21 of the past 22 end-of-season leaders for Arizona.

WASHINGTON (7-3): QB **Jake Browning's** record as a starter is 36-13, matching the Pac-12 career record of 36 wins by a starting quarterback, which he shares with Oregon's Marcus Mariota (2012-14) and Stanford's Kevin Hogan (2012-15) ... He's now sixth in career passing yards (11,347) and in career touchdown passes (91) in the Pac-12 ... Browning is just the sixth player in Pac-12 history to account for 100 touchdowns (107 total: 91 pass, 16 rush) ... RB **Myles Gaskin** needs 229 rushing yards to reach 1,000 yards for the season. If accomplished, he'd be the first player in Pac-12 history and 10th ever in FBS history to rush for 1,000 or more yards in four seasons... LB **Ben Burr-Kirven** led the Huskies in tackles for the ninth time in 10 games this season as he posted 12 tackles in the win over Stanford. He currently leads the Pac-12 with 134 tackles and is second in the nation with 13.4 tackles per game.

The winner of each Division will be determined by the record in all games played (both divisional and cross-divisional) within the conference. In the event of a tie, the following procedures will be applied to determine the Pac-12 Championship Game representatives

Two-Team Tie.

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
 - a. If no game is played between the two tied teams or that game ends in a tie, the following tie-breaking procedures would be applied:
2. Record in games played within the division.
3. Record against the next highest placed team in the division (Based on record in all games played within the conference), proceeding through the division.
4. Record in common conference games.
5. Total number of wins in a 12-game season. The following conditions will apply to the calculation of the total number of wins:
 - a. Only one win against a team from the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision or lower division will be counted annually.
 - b. Any games that are exempted from counting against the annual maximum number of football contests per NCAA rules (current Bylaw 17.9.5.2) shall not be included.
6. Highest ranking by SportSource Analytics following the last weekend of regular-season games.
7. Coin toss.

Multiple-Team Ties.

The following procedures will only be used to eliminate all but two teams, at which point the two-team tie-breaking procedure will be applied.

1. Head-to-head (Best record in games among the tied teams).
2. Record in games played within the division.
3. Record against the next highest placed team in the division (based on record in all games played within the conference), proceeding through the division.
4. Record in common conference games.
5. Highest ranking by SportSource Analytics Following the last weekend of regular-season games.

Determination of Home Team in Pac-12 Championship

The home team in the Pac-12 Championship Game will be determined by the record in all games played within the conference. In the event of a tie, the following procedures will be applied to determine the home team.

Tie-breaking Procedure.

1. Head-to-head, if applicable.
2. Record against the next highest-placed common opponent in the conference (based on record in all games played within the conference), proceeding through the conference.
3. Record in common conference games.
4. Highest ranking by SportSource Analytics following the last weekend of regular-season games.
5. Coin toss.
