PAC-12 FOOTBALL HONORS

Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year – Gardner Minshew II, QB, Washington State: Minshew, from Brandon, Miss., not only led the Pac-12 in passing, but the FBS as well, averaging 373.1 yards per game. He completed 433 of 613 pass attempts for 4,477 yards and 36 touchdowns, with just nine interceptions. He threw for 300 or more yards in 11 games, including a season-best 473 yards in Washington State's 69-28 win over Arizona, where he tied a Pac-12 record with seven touchdown passes in regulation play. His 4,477 passing yards are third-most in a single season at Washington State and fifth-most in Pac-12 history. With a bowl game remaining, he needs 243 passing yards to set the Pac-12 single-season mark of 4,719 set in 2015 by California's Jared Goff. This marks the seventh time Washington State has claimed the conference offensive player of the year honor, and first since Jason Gesser in 2002. Minshew joins former WSU QBs Gesser (2002), Ryan Leaf (1997) and Drew Bledsoe (1992) as Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year.

Pat Tillman Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year – Ben Burr-Kirven, LB, Washington: Burr-Kirven, a senior from Menlo Park, Calif., anchored the Husky defense that led the Pac-12 and was 12th in the nation in total defense (301.8 yards allowed per game), led the Pac-12 in pass defense (185.4 yards allowed per game), and second in rush defense (116.4 yards allowed per game). He led the Pac-12 with 165 tackles and his 12.7 tackles per game ranked third-best in the FBS. He recorded 10 or more tackles in 12 of 13 games. It's a repeat honor for the Huskies, following DL Vita Vea's award-winning season last year. Burr-Kirven is the sixth Husky to garner the honor and the first Pac-12 player to earn both Conference Player of the Year and the Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Pac-12 Freshman Offensive Player of the Year – Jermar Jefferson, RB, Oregon State: Jefferson, a freshman from Harbor City, Calif., topped all FBS freshmen in rushing with 1,380 yards (5.8 yards/carry) and an average of 115.0 yards per game (7th overall in the FBS). His 12 rushing touchdowns were tied for second most in the Pac-12. Jefferson's 1,380 rushing yards set an Oregon State true freshman rushing record and is the sixth-best single-season total. He twice rushed for 200 or more yards in a game, including a Pac-12 freshman single-game record 254 yards vs. Arizona State. Jefferson also picked up 25 receptions for 147 yards during the season. He's the second Oregon State running back tabbed Freshman of the Year, joining RB Jacquizz Rodgers who won the award in 2008. Honorable Mention Freshman Offensive Player of the Year: CJ Verdell, RB, Oregon; Amon-Ra St. Brown, WR, USC; Max Borghi, RB, Washington State.

Pac-12 Freshman Defensive Player of the Year – Merlin Robertson, LB, Arizona State: Robertson, a freshman from Gardena, Calif., ranked 20th in the Pac-12 with 6.4 tackles per game, while his team-leading 77 total tackles led all Pac-12 freshmen. Named Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week after he tallied nine tackles and 1.5 sacks in a 16-13 win over Michigan State. Posted a season-best 11 tackles at Washington. In all, Robertson had 77 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss, 5.0 sacks and an interception. Robertson's play kept the Sun Devils in every game as their five losses were by seven or fewer points. He's the third Sun Devil to earn Freshman Defensive Player of the Year, joining LB Vontaze Burfict (2009) and DE Junior Onyeali (2010), and the fifth Sun Devil overall to earn Pac-12 Freshman of the Year honors, along with TE Zach Miller (2004) and DE Terrell Suggs (2000). Honorable Mention Freshman Defensive Player of the Year: Paulson Adebo, DB, Stanford; Jay Tufele, DL, USC.

Pac-12 Coach of the Year – Mike Leach, Washington State: Guided the Cougars to their sixth 10-win season, and first since 2003. Washington State won seven straight Pac-12 games and finished tied atop the Pac-12 North Division standings with a 7-2 league record, 10-2 overall. Under Leach, the Cougars climbed to No. 8 in the College Football Playoff rankings where they sat for four weeks (Oct. 30 – Nov. 20). The Cougars led the Pac-12 in scoring (38.3 ppg), total offense (461.8 ypg) and passing offense (379.8 ypg). In seven seasons at Washington State, Leach's record stands at 48-40. Over the last four seasons, his record is 36-15, with at least eight wins in each of those four seasons. It's the second time Leach has earned Pac-12 Coach of the Year honors (Co-Coach with Stanford's David Shaw in 2015).

PAC-12 RECORD CLIMBERS: Washington QB **Jake Browning** and RB **Myles Gaskin** have been climbing the Pac-12 career charts and are among the all-time top five in several categories.

PAC-12 NOTEBOOK - THE SOUTH

ARIZONA: WR **Shawn Poindexter** had 11 TD receptions this season, which tied him five others for most TD receptions in a season in program history ... RB **J.J. Taylor** had five 100-yard rushing games this season. His 1,434 rushing yards on the season ranks as the fourth-most in program history, while his 119.5 yards per game average ranks sixth in the FBS ... LB **Colin Schooler** finished the season with a team-leading 119 tackles. His 21.5 tackles-for-loss are fifth all-time at Arizona in single-season ... QB **Khalil Tate** finished the season with 26 TD passes, which were fifth-most in school history.

ARIZONA STATE: It's the seventh bowl game in the last eight seasons for the Sun Devils. It's the second Las Vegas Bowl appearance for Arizona State ... Arizona State is 4-1 in games decided by three points or less this season ... WR **N'Keal Harry** has a catch in all 37 games of his career and has 22 career TD receptions (tied for fifth all-time at ASU). His 213 career receptions and 2,889 receiving yards are third all-time at ASU ... RB **Eno Benjamin** set a school season record with 277 carries. Benjamin's 1,524 rushing yards this season are the most in a season by a Sun Devil during the Pac-10/Pac-12 era and second in school history. He needs 42 yards in the upcoming bowl game to set the ASU single-season mark, passing Woody Green (1,565 yards, 1972) ... Freshmen have accounted for 33.6 percent of all of ASU's tackles this season (265 of 788).

COLORADO: RB **Travon McMillian** finished the season with 1,009 rushing yards on 201 carries (5.0 avg) and 7 TDs. WR **Laviska Shenault** finished the season with 1,011 yards on 86 receptions (11.6 avg) and 6 TDs. It's the first time in CU history the Buffaloes have a 1,000 rusher and receiver in the same season ... Shenault's 112.3 receiving yards per game average is fourth-best in the FBS ... The Colorado defense allowed a season-low 211 yards at California, the fewest allowed on the road since 2005 (208 yards at Oklahoma State). The Buffs held Cal to 1-of-17 on third down - the second worst by an opponent in CU history ... QB **Steven Montez** threw 19 TD passes this season, the record by a CU junior ... LB **Rick Gamboa** tied the school record for most games played in a career by a defensive player with his 50th.

UCLA: QB **Wilson Speight** finished the season completing 29 of 47 pass attempts for 466 yards. All career-bests for Speight. The 466 yards passing were the fifth-most in a single game in program history ... RB **Joshua Kelley** finished the year with 1,243 yards, which is 10th for a single season in UCLA history. Kelley ran for a touchdown for the eighth game in a row (12 total TDs) ... UCLA went over 400 yards in total offense in six of its last eight games ... TE **Caleb Wilson** caught nine passes for 184 yards in the season finale. It was the third 100-yard game of the season and fifth of his career. His 60 receptions and 965 receiving yards this season rank 11th on the school's single-season list ... DB **Adarius Pickett** finished with 123 tackles in 2018, the 15th most in a single year at UCLA ... The Bruins played a program record 21 true freshmen this season.

USC: Freshman QB **J.T. Daniels** completed 37-of-51 (.725) for a season-best 349 yards, 1 TD and no interceptions in the 24-17 loss to No. 3 Notre Dame. The 37 completions were a USC single-game record and it was his third 300-plus yard passing game this season. Daniels threw 10 of his 14 TD passes in the last six games ... WRs **Tyler Vaughns** had 12 receptions for 120 yards and 1 TD, while **Amon-Ra St. Brown** posted 10 catches for 94 yards vs. Notre Dame. Both set new career-highs for receptions ... Vaughns, St. Brown and WR **Michael Pittman Jr.**, who added seven catches for 91 yards, combined for 159 receptions for 2,182 yards and 15 TDs this season ... ILB **Cameron Smith** led the Trojans with a team-high 12 tackles in the loss, giving him 361 career tackles. He is the first Trojan since Dennis Johnson in 1977-78-79 to lead USC in tackles in three consecutive seasons.

UTAH: The Utes have won 14 of their last 15 bowl games. While this will be the Utah's first appearance in the Holiday Bowl, it played in two previous Poinsettia Bowl games in San Diego. The Utes defeated Navy (35-32) in 2007, then defeated California (37-27) in 2009 ... QB **Jason Shelley** has filled in admirably in place of injured starter **Tyler Huntley**. Huntley completed 150-of-234 for 1,788 yards and 12 TDs, while rushing for 304 yards before suffering an injury during the Arizona State game. Shelley stepped in and completed 48-of-82 for 624 yards and 3 TDs, with 112 rushing yards and 3 TDs to close out the regular season with three straight wins and clinch the South Division for the first time since the Utes joined the Conference ... Likewise at running back where **Armand Shyne** has filled in for **Zack Moss** the last three games. Moss had already accumulated 1,092 rushing yards and 11 TDs in nine games before suffering an injury prior to the Oregon game. Shyne responded with 313 rushing yards and 3 TDs the last four starts ... LB **Chase Hansen** leads the Pac-12 with 22.0 tackles for loss, while DE **Bradlee Anae** leads the Pac-12 with 8.0 sacks ... PK **Matt Gay** set the Utah school record for consecutive field goals with 21 consecutive field goals before a miss of 56 yards at Colorado. He bests the previous record of 18, set by Joe Phillips (2009-10). Gay has made a school-record eight field goals from 50-yards or better.

PAC-12 NOTEBOOK - THE NORTH

CALIFORNIA: Cal is bowl eligible for the first time since 2015. The Bears are making their third appearance in the Cheez-it Bowl. The bowl initially started as the Copper Bowl in 1989 and has undergone a litany of name changes. Cal defeated Wyoming (17-15) in the 1990 Copper Bowl, then knocked off Virginia Tech (52-49) in the 2003 Insight Bowl ... The Bears led the Pac-12 with 24 takeaways (7 fumble recoveries/17 interceptions) ... Of the Pac-12 leading 17 interceptions, five were returned for a touchdown ... The Bears' defense has allowed less than 100 yards rushing five times this season and was third in rushing defense, allowing 132.3 yards per game. The pass defense ranked second in the league, allowing 187.1 yards per game ... LB **Evan Weaver** posted double-digits tackles in nine games, while fellow LB **Jordan Kunaszyk** accomplished the same in eight games, including 22 against UCLA. Weaver now has 143 stops (11.9 avg) and Kunaszyk has 133 (11.1 avg). Last time Cal had multiple players with 100 tackles in a season was 2007 (Thomas DeCoud 116, Worrell Williams, 105, Anthony Felder 101).

OREGON: The Ducks are making their first appearance in the Redbox Bowl ... With the 55-15 win at Oregon State, the Ducks won by at least 40 points in back-to-back games for the first time in series history ... Oregon had two players (**Travis Dye** - 199 yards; **CJ Verdell** - 187 yards) rush for third all-time at Oregon ... Herbert moved into sixth on Oregon's single-season passing yards list with 2,985 yards ... The Ducks had four players come away with multiple INTs in a game this season - S **Jevon Holland**, CB **Thomas Graham Jr.**, S **Ugochukwu Amadi**, CB **Deommodore Lenoir** ... LB **Troy Dye** became the 15th player in program history to reach 300 career tackles.

OREGON STATE: The Beavers scored 313 points (26.1 ppg), a +5.4 improvement over last year's scoring offense (20.7 ppg) ... WR **Isaiah Hodgins** hauled in eight receptions for 133 yards. It was his fourth 100-plus yard receiving game this season. He ended the season with 59 receptions for 876 yards ... Oregon State is one of two Pac-12 teams (also Washington State) to have three receivers with 50 or more receptions this season - Hodgins (59), **Timmy Hernandez** (58) and WR **Trevon Bradford** (56) ... RB **Jemar Jefferson** finished the season with an OSU true freshman rushing record with 1,380 yards, which is sixth on OSU's single-season list.

STANFORD: The Cardinal are bowl eligible for the 10th consecutive year and is making its fifth Sun Bowl appearance. Stanford is 3-1 in the Sun Bowl ... **K.J. Costello** has thrown at least one scoring pass in 16 straight games. He's thrown for 300 or more yards seven times this season, only Steve Stenstrom (8 in 1993) has accomplished that as a Cardinal. Costello's 3,435 passing yards this season rank as third most on Stanford's single-season list behind Stenstrom (2,627 in 1993) and Andrew Luck (3,517 in 2011) ... WR **JJ Arcega-Whiteside** had five receptions for 109 yards and 1 TD in the win over California. He set the school single-season mark with 15 TD receptions. He's had 100 or more receiving yards in four of his last six games ... Stanford's four losses this season have come against the AP's current No. 3, No. 9, No. 12 and No. 20-ranked teams in the nation. (Notre Dame, Washington, Washington State, Utah).

WASHINGTON: The Huskies are making their 15th Rose Bowl Game appearance, having sported a 7-6-1 record. Washington's last appearance was a 34-24 win over Purdue in 2001 ... QB **Jake Browning** is the Pac-12 Conference's all-time winningest starting quarterback with 39 wins. He is now 39-13 (.750) in his career ... He's now fifth in career passing yards (11,983), fourth total offense (12,229) and sixth in career TD passes (94) in the Pac-12 ... RB **Myles Gaskin** is the first player in Pac-12 history and 10th ever in FBS history to rush for 1,000 or more yards in four straight seasons. He now has 5,202 for his career, third all-time in the Pac-12. His 55 career rushing TDs are also third all-time in the Pac-12, just five shy of matching the record of 60 set by Oregon's Royce Freeman last season ... LB **Ben Burr-Kirven** has led the Huskies in tackles 12 times in 13 games this season. He currently leads the FBS with 165 tackles and is third in the nation with 12.7 tackles per game.

WASHINGTON STATE: Owns 10 wins for the sixth time in WSU history ... This will be the second Alamo Bowl appearance for the Cougars. WSU dropped a 10-3 decision to Baylor in 1994 ... RB **James Williams** caught seven passes, upping his season-total to 76, breaking his own WSU record for single-season receptions by a running back (71, 2017), the 76 receptions are 6th-most in WSU single-season history by any player ... Williams scored 2 TDs vs. Washington, upping season total TDs to 16, 3rd-most in WSU single-season history. His 27 career TDs are fourth-most in WSU history ... QB **Gardner Minshew II** has thrown for 300-plus yards in 11 games this season in accumulating 4,477 passing yards, third-most in WSU history and fifth-most in Pac-12 history ... WR **Darrien Molton** made his 47th career start, one away from tying the WSU record of 48 (Micah Hannam, OL, 2007-10) ... LB **Peyton Pelluer** has played in a WSU record 53 career games.

2018 PAC-12 FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

SANTA CLARA, Calif. — On a night when neither offense could do much of anything, it was only fitting that a pass that bounced off a receiver's hands and leg turned into the winning play.

Byron Murphy returned a deflected interception 66 yards for the game's only touchdown to lead No. 10 Washington to a 10-3 victory over No. 17 Utah in the Pac-12 championship game Friday night and a berth in the Rose Bowl.

"You know, life isn't easy. A Pac-12 championship, is not going to be easy," coach Chris Petersen said. "It's not reality. If it happens, go buy lottery tickets because it's not going to be like that. That's just luck. It is a grind, it's hard."

The matchup between the two stingiest defenses in the conference lived up to the billing with Washington (10-3, No. 11 CFP) holding Utah (9-4, No. 17 CFP) to 188 yards and both offenses limited to just one field goal apiece all game.

That's why it was up to the defense to come up with the score for the Huskies.

Jason Shelley's pass hit Siaosi Mariner in the hands inside the Washington 35. But Mariner couldn't hold onto the pass and it ricocheted off his leg and into the hands of Murphy, who raced 66 yards for the score that made it 10-3.

"The ball came up and I just knew I had to make a play," Murphy said. "The opportunity was there. I just had to make sure I took it."

Jordan Miller intercepted another pass from Shelley on the following drive and Murphy got his second interception of the game the next time Utah had the ball. The Huskies sealed the victory with a fourth-down stop in the final minute to earn a trip to Pasadena.

"They play the kind of game we want to play," linebacker Ben Burr-Kirven said. "They play a physical brand of football. They want to run the ball down our throats and I think we're built to play that kind of game."

Murphy broke up the final pass on a throw to Mariner that the Utes thought should have been called pass interference.

"Everybody's hurt," Shelley said. "We were that close. We played that bad and we still lost by only seven points."

The Huskies had four drives of at least 10 plays but got only one field goal out of those. They were stopped on a fourth-and-6 from the Utah 23 on the opening drive, threw an interception in Utah territory on the third drive and had a field goal blocked in the fourth quarter.

The one score came on Peyton Henry's 29-yard field goal late in the first half.

"It's really hard to describe because we're so excited about our defense out there and in some ways frustrated on the other side," Petersen said. "We just couldn't get things done like we needed to."

That Utes tied it with a score on the opening possession of the third quarter when Matt Gay's 53-yard field goal just cleared the cross bar but couldn't get anything else.

THE TAKEAWAY

Utah: The Utes made it to the title game despite losing quarterback Tyler Huntley and running back Zack Moss to injuries in a four-day span in early November. They then lost leading receiver Britain Covey to what appears to be a serious knee injury in this game.

Shelley and Armand Shyne stepped in and let the Utes to three straight wins and a spot in this game but they weren't good enough against the Huskies. Shelley's three interceptions were his first turnovers as a starter. He threw for just 137 yards. Shyne ran for 37 yards on 11 carries.

"It's hard when you lose a game and you don't give up a defensive touchdown," coach Kyle Whittingham said. "It doesn't happen very often. But give the Huskies credit, because there's a reason we didn't do much on offense."

Washington: The Huskies came into the season with playoff hopes but a season-opening loss to Auburn and then a pair of losses to Oregon and California in October ended that quest. But Washington still managed to win the conference and will go to the Rose Bowl for the first time since the 2000 season.
