PAC-12 GYMNASTICS NEARS THE END OF THE REGULAR SEASON

There are just two weeks left in the regular Pac-12 gymnastics season as seven of the eight league makes an appearance on this week's top 25 poll ... Last week in the Pac-12, No. 5 UTAH swept past WASHINGTON, 197.125-193.475. No. 9 UCLA and No. 20 ARIZONA had a showdown that ended with UCLA on top, 197.500-196.250. No. 15 OREGON STATE hosted a tri-meet featuring No. 9 Nebraska and No. 21 ARIZONA STATE. Nebraska won the tri-meet, followed by the Beavers at second and the Sun Devils at third ... All league teams except for Arizona and Oregon State hit the road for tough competitions involving non-conference opponents. Utah and UCLA travel to play in a tri-meet hosted by No. 7 Michigan in what is sure to be one of the most competitive meets of the year for all three squads. California heads to Kentucky, Stanford to Alabama, Arizona State to Oklahoma and Washington to BYU, all on Friday, March 7. The Beavers head to Tucson to play the Wildcats on Sunday, March 9 ... Weekly Pac-12 honors include Gymnast of the Week Olivia Courtney of UCLA, Specialist of the Week Samantha Peszek of UCLA, and Freshman of the Week Selynna Felix-Terrazas of Arizona.

UCLA VOTED PRESEASON FAVORITE IN PAC-12 COACHES POLL

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. - In a poll taken by the Conference's eight women's gymnastics coaches, UCLA was voted the preseason favorite to win the 2014 Pac-12 regular season, the Conference announced today.

The Bruins received 46 points with five first-place votes and were voted fourth in the national preseason coaches poll. UTAH tallied 45 points, receiving the remaining three first-place votes and was tabbed second. STANFORD sits in third place with with 37 points in the poll. The Utes and Cardinal also made an appearance in the top 10 of the national poll with the sixth and ninth spots, respectively. OREGON STATE is slotted fourth in the Pac-12 poll with 31 points and represents the Conference with a 12th-place ranking in the national poll.

The second half of the poll is led by ARIZONA, which claims the 17th spot in the national preseason coaches poll. WASHINGTON is picked sixth, with a spot in the national top 25 at 20th. Rounding out the poll, CALIFORNIA and ARIZONA STATE were picked seventh and eighth with a national ranking of 22nd and 25th, respectively. All eight Pac-12 teams are ranked in the top 25 national preseason poll.

This is the third-consecutive year of the preseason coaches poll with UCLA claiming the top spot. The Bruins finished as the runner-up in the 2013 Pac-12 Championships to the Beavers. The 2014 season is set to begin Sunday, January 5, 2014. Pac-12 gymnastics will be featured on the Pac-12 Networks, including the 2014 Pac-12 Championships on March 22, 2014. UCLA'S COURTNEY NAMED GYMNAST OF THE WEEK UCLA'S PESZEK SELECTED SPECIALIST OF THE WEEK ARIZONA'S FELIX-TERRAZAS VOTED FRESHMAN/NEWCOMER OF THE WEEK

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. - The Pac-12 Conference office announced today the Pac-12 women's gymnastics weekly honors for the week of Feb. 24 - Mar. 3. UCLA's Olivia Courtney was named the Gymnast of the Week, UCLA's Samantha Peszek was voted Specialist of the Week, and ARIZONA's Selynna Felix-Terrazas was selected as the Freshman/Newcomer of the Week.

Courtney and the Bruins were able to record a UCLA season-high 197.5 in a win at Arizona. Senior Olivia Courtney won the all-around for the second straight meet, scoring a season-best 39.5. Courtney tied for first on vault with teammate Samantha Peszek and tied for second on floor. Her efforts on the floor routine helped lead the Bruins to the teams season-high 49.5. Additionally, Courtney tied for fourth on beam (9.85) and seventh on bars (9.825).

Senior Samantha Peszek scored 9.90 on all three events in which she competed to share the title on vault and bars and placing second on beam. The Indianapolis, Ind., native posted scores to help UCLA earn a season-high 197.5 on the road to take down Arizona. She is tied at 15th in the nation on bars with a season average is 9.90 on bars. So far this season Peszek has racked up nine 9.9 scores and nine individual victories over 14 routines.

Arizona freshman Selynna Felix-Terrazas has made big impact for the Wildcats in a season filled with injury with the upperclassmen. Felix-Terrazas, a Tucson, Ariz., native, has been contributing all season long with numbers counting scored to team totals. This past meet, she scored a career and season-best 9.90 on bars to take first place against the Bruins.

This week marks UCLA's third Gymnast of the Week honor on the 2014 season with two of those honors going to Olivia Courtney. This is Samantha Peszek's second consecutive Specialist of the Week honor and accounts for all three of UCLA's honors in this category for the 2014 season. This is Selynna Felix-Terrazas's first Freshman/Newcomer of the Week honor and Arizona's first weekly honor of the year.

Gymnast of the Week has been selected every week of the season since 2001. The Specialist of the Week award was added in 2008. It is the second year for Freshman/Newcomer of the Week.

ARIZONA

The Wildcats fell to UCLA this Saturday, 196.250-197.500. Junior Kristen Klarenbach led the team on vault with a score of 9.875. Her score was good enough to earn the third place title. Shelby Edwards contributed with a 9.825. On bars, Arizona was led by both freshman Selynna Felix- Terrazas and Allie Flores. Both gymnasts earned scores of 9.900. This score marks a career high for Felix-Terrazas.

Freshman Dana Ho performed well on beam producing a career-high 9.875 while claiming her first-ever title on the event. Alicia Austurias was runner up in the all around with a score of 39.275.

OREGON STATE

Oregon State fell to Nebraska 196.650-196.625. Chelsea Tang led Oregon State with a 39.325 in the all around. The Beavers reached 49+ on three events with a season-high 49.350 on the uneven bars. Madeline Gadinier (9.80), Tang (9.90) and Hannah Caset (9.90) all posted career-high on bars. The Beavers took second in a meet that hosted Nebraska and Arizona State.

Utah shined on floor with Mary Beth Lofgren (9.90), Lia Del Priore (9.95), Becky Tutka (9.925), and Dabritz (9.90) scoring high to set up Tory Wilson for a big routine. Wilson was able to incorporate a modified floor pass that included a rare full twisting double back. Wilson went on to place first in the all-around.

WASHINGTON

Washington fell to the Utes Friday evening, 193.475-197.125. Washington competed with three all-around competitors with Jackie McCartin entering the event for the first time in her career. She went on to post high marks on the uneven bars (9.850) and floor (9.875) to finish second with a mark of 38.950. Aliza Vaccher and Allison Northey shined on the beam as well posting scores of 9.850.
