ATHLETES QUOTES

Henry Rono, Washington State, winner of steeplechase in meet record of 8:35.4 -- "I planned to get out in front and lead all the way. I've been a little sick. I caught a cold a couple of weeks ago and couldn't run the next week. I'm still a little stiff. I'd like to run 29 something in the 10,000. I'm supposed to run in London (in an international meet) next Wednesday at 5,000. I was supposed to run at the ~~Qmk~~ Olympics in Montreal. I trained for it, and we were all disappointed that we couldn't run."

Scott Nielsen, Washington, after having won his second consecutive Pac-8 Hammer Throw (213'11") "I first thought it would take a throw of about 220 feet to win the title. But when Buxton threw 206 on his throw, I thought I better move. After my first throw over 213 I didn't feel pressed. I didn't feel good with any of my throws and in fact it was my second worst meet of the season."

Greg Canfield, California, leader in decathlon with 3612 points -- (Asked how he felt to be ahead by one point) "Am I ahead? By one Point? I hadn't heard. I actually expected to be leading, or at least in the top two because the first day is usually my best, but I was disappointed today. I normally would be in the 3700-3800 range. I didn't do as well as I'd like. I usually run the quarter in the 49s and run a 51 today. I sprained my ankle about two weeks ago vaulting in practice. It's hard to run the turns on an ankle like that."

Brian Mondschein, Washington, 2nd in decathlon with 3611 points -- "I thought I'd be leading after the first day. I would have liked to be at 3700 points now. My high jump was only 5-7 and I've gone 6-1 $\frac{1}{4}$. Washington recruited me as a decathlon prospect, but this is just the second decathlon I've competed in for Washington and I'm a senior. I've been running the intermediate hurdles since I got here."

Mike Tully, UCLA (New meet Record in the Pole Vault) My timing was very poor today. I didn't feel that anyone was pushing me. It seemed just like another dual meet today. I am going to start working with a little more intensity in preparation of the NCAA meet. I was attempting to extend the workout in effect with raising the bar at 17-10. I was feeling better at the end and thought I was capable of a better vault. The wind was no factor.

Duncan Atwood, Washington, javelin champion with meet record fo 265-9 -- "I seem to throw best when I'm pushed. When I was leading at 227 I wasn't too motivated, then Harry (Kooznetsoff of WSU) threw 244 and I threw a lot better. The key to the javelin is speed down the runway, then conversion of that speed into the javelin. Today I could tell a step before I threw that it was going to be a good one. This was my best ever. I threw 263-6 in late May last year and that was a PR by 21 feet. We've had a history of good javelin throwers at Washington. We get superb coaching."

ATHLETE'S QUOTES

Andy Clifford, California, 1500: SUPRISED? "Yeah, what happened, where were those guys. I can't believe it happened. I think they ran a very honest race. But I thought that I still had to prove myself. I ran an even pace through the first three laps. I kept thinking some one was going to go by me on the straight away. "

BARRY WILLIAMS, UCLA, 1500 runner-up: Andy and I go back a ways and we know what to expect of each other but those guys that wnet out were not there when we expected them.

Clancy Edwards, USC, 100 winner: "I didn't get out but it was a good start for me because I'm a slow starter. The guy from Washington State had me worried but I was able to catch him before the wire. It's the first time I've run against him."

James Owens, UCLA, 110 HH winner: "I was trying to focus on each hurdle individually. I hit one hurdle -- I think it was the 6th or 7th. I knew this race was going to be very competitive. Greg has been coming on strong. It's definitely been good for each of us, but sometimes in practice we've been concentrating on beating each other rather than working on the things we need to improve. We're not doing that so much now."

Greg Foster, UCLA, 110 HH runnerup: "Working with James every day has made me a lot better. We've been competitive in practice. In meets we just try to concentrate on each hurdle."

SCOTT OVERTON, California, Discus: "I didn't feel that good out there. Technically, I wasn't in the groove. My legs felt tired after the good throw, and I was getting any lift in my throws. But I was emotionally in today's competition. I figured it would take at least 195' to win it, once I reached that mark I sort of relaxed but when Ralph (Fruguguietti) good a throw of 192' I kind of got "jacked" again."

Tim Walker, USC, high jump: "All year I have been jumping ~~60~~ 6-10. Since I broke my right ankle last fall, I hadn't done 7-0 until today. I knew it would come. I relaxed more today at 7-0. It all came together---my pop, lean and run. My problem has ~~been~~ been my run. I haven't been able to approach the bar at the best angle because of my injury. I had to clear at least 7-1 today to qualify for the NCAA. I've done 7-1½ indoors in high school, ~~my~~ but my best outdoors until today was 7-0 both in high school and last year at USC."

Tom Andrews, USC, 400 and 400 IH: "I felt like I could run (the 400) in the 45's after the trials yesterday. I wasn't all that sure about winning the intermediates, though. Graybehl is very competitive. (Will he run in mile relay?) "If I feel good enough. Right now I don't feel good enough (pant, pant). But we don't operate as individuals at USC. We operate as a team. Everyone is coming by to get me up for it. I'll probably run the intermediates and both relays at the NCAA. I wouldn't be able to live through a double like this there."

Clancy Edwards, USC, 200-meter dash winner: "I could have run faster, but I stumbled with about 30 meters to go. I guess I tightened up. I'm really surprised at my time. I knew it was going to be a fast race with (Millard) Hampton (UCLA) in there. I thought he (Hampton) would be making a comeback after his loss in the dual meet. He looked good in the trials. I'm sorry he pulled up. I tried to accelerate off the turn. That's when I start lifting my legs high. I didn't see ~~anybody~~ anybody after coming off the turn. I will take it easy until the nationals and not run at Modesto. ~~X~~ The coach would like ~~me~~ ~~me~~ to take me out of the 100 at the NCAA, but I'd like to run them all (100, 200 and 400 relay). The coaches at USC have helped me run tall and more relaxed. This ~~wax~~weather hurts me. I like it warmer."

Willie Banks, UCLA, Triple Jump. "I knew I was on. You always know when you get a good one because it doesn't hurt. It came on my second jump. Ian Campbell of Washington St. is a very good one and I was glad to get off the good jump early. Usually it creates pressure on the others and when you press the others it can force mistakes which can be to your advantage. This is the first Championship I have won in the college level. Last week was the really first big win at the college level as well (West Coast Relay).

Vern Wolfe, USC Coach -- Worried? I was worried before we started yesterday. I felt better about halfway through today."

Jim Bush, UCLA Coach -- "We competed as well as we could today. I'm just sorry to see some like Hampton get hurt. It's a hamstring - we don't know how severe. Any muscle pull can be serious."

Tom Andrews, USC, after mile relay -- "Boy am I tired!"
