MIKE RAMOS OF WASHINGTON:

"The record wasn't one of my goals this year. I looked beyond it. So it was gravy and I'm happy to have it. I'm more interested in the American record (8634 by Bruce Jenner). I wanted to score 8500 points today and I thought I'd be close to doing that. As it turned out, I was. I went out too fast in the 1500, going 69 seconds instead of 73. That took its toll on the third lap...I had a great first day...Yesterday was the first time I high jumped this year and this was supposed to be a meet where I worked the bugs out in the high jump. It's coincidence that I PR'd in it (7-1)...The last six weeks in a row I've no-heighted in the pole vault. It was a little scary on my third jump at 15-1, but I'm confident at that height."

QUOTE FROM TORE GUSTAFSSON, WINNER: "I thought if I would throw 252 on the first throw, I would know I'd won. I just couldn't do it. Today I don't know what happened.
