STANFORD ADVANCES TO DEFEND NCAA VOLLEYBALL TITLE

• Defending NCAA Champion and Pac-12 Champion STANFORD makes its 23rd trip to the NCAA semifinal, the most for any program in the country. The third-seeded Cardinal's appearance marks the 35th time in 39 tournaments at least one Pac-12 team has advanced that far. Stanford faces seventh-seeded Minnesota at PPG Arena in Pittsburgh, Pa., on Thursday, December 19. The winner of that match goes on to the national championship on Saturday, Dec. 21 and faces the winner of top-seeded Baylor vs. fourth-seeded Wisconsin.

• The Cardinal are looking to become the first Pac-12 team to win back-to-back NCAA titles since USC won in 2002 and 2003. Stanford won back-to-back crowns in 1996 and 1997. UCLA is the only other league team to win back-to-back, doing so in 1990 and 1991. The Pac-12 has won a NCAA-record 16 of 38 NCAA titles awarded.

• Six Pac-12 teams earned NCAA Tournament bids, the Conference going 8-3 through the first two rounds. In addition to Stanford earning a top-16 seeding, WASHINGTON was tabbed the No. 8 seed, advancing to the regional final for the 15th time. UCLA, USC, UTAH and WASHINGTON STATE earned at-large bids, as well. It marks the 20th-consecutive year at least Pac-12 six teams have participated in the "Big Dance." Stanford is one of just two programs in NCAA history to have participated in all 39 postseason events.

• Five of the six Pac-12 teams were making a return trip to the NCAA Tournament after earning bids last season. UCLA was back in the postseason after missing out in 2018. It bounced back to post a winning record and a fourth-place showing in the Pac-12, a year after recording its first-ever losing record.

• USC made its 29th-straight NCAA Tournament appearance and the Huskies made their 18th-straight. Utah and WSU have earned a postseason bids the last three years. The Utes advanced to the regional semifinal for the second time in three years. They are the only team so far in the postseason to have taken a set from the Cardinal, losing to the defending national champion, 3-2.

• Stanford won its 19th all-time Pac-12 crown. UCLA junior Mac May was named Pac-12 Player of the Year, the first Bruin to win the honor since 1994. Stanford seniors Jenna Gray and Morgan Hentz were tabbed Pac-12 Setter of the Year and Pac-12 Libero of the Year for the third-straight years, respectively. WSU's Magda Jehlarova became the first Cougar to be named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year.

• 21 Pac-12 student-athletes earned AVCA All-Region recognitions, led by Utah's Beth Launier and Dani Drews, who were named Pacific South Coach and Player of the Year. Washington's Kara Bajema was the Pacific North Player of the Year and Washington State's Jehlarova was tabbed the Freshman of the Year.

PAC-12 IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Pac-12 has captured 16 out of 38 NCAA titles, including 14 of the last 28. With Stanford winning its eighth crown last year, and two of the last three, it is now the nation's leader in NCAA titles. Four different Pac-12 teams have claimed the NCAA titles and has had at least six tournament berths for 20-consecutive years. Pac-12 teams have compiled an impressive 483-256 (.654) record in NCAA play. Toss out the 20 postseason matches between Conference teams since 2001 and the league's NCAA Tournament record against non-conference foes stands at 263-105 (.715) during that span. Over the last 20 years, Pac-12 teams are 120-20 (.857) in the first round, including posting a NCAA-record 10-0 in 2015 after a NCAA-record 10 league teams earned bids that season.

The Pac-12 has placed at least one Conference team in the regional semifinal every year of the tournament. 18 times in the history of the Conference, the Pac-12 has had at least three teams advance to the regional final. A league team has also advanced to the national semifinal every year of the tournament except four times (1003, 1998, 2009, 2015), advancing a team to the championship match 26 times. Every Pac-12 member has earned a NCAA Tournament berth since 2013 and seven different teams have reached the national semifinal all-time.

STANFORD IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT ... Defending national champion Stanford earned the No. 3-overall seed in the NCAA Tournament after claiming the Pac-12 crown for the 19th time ever. Stanford is one of just two teams to have earned a berth to all 39 NCAA Tournaments (along with Penn State) and after winning it all last season, is the nation's leader with eight NCAA titles. The Cardinal boast the most wins in the history of the tournament, going 129-31 (.804) all-time and was the first to 100 postseason wins. Stanford, which has won the Pac-12 title in each of head coach Kevin Hambly's three seasons, improved to 39-0 in NCAA opening-round matches, dismissing Denver in straight sets, then cruised to a 3-0 win over Cal Poly in the second round. After a hard-fought five-set match against a familiar foe in Utah in the regional semifinal, the Cardinal defeated No. 11-seed Penn State, 3-0, to advance to its 23rd-straight national semifinal appearance, the most for any program in the country. The Cardinal are looking to win back-to-back titles for the first time since winning the 1996 and 1997 titles.

UCLA IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT ... UCLA was back in the NCAA Tournament after failing to miss the postseason last year, which was also the first time in the history of the program the Bruins had recorded a losing record. UCLA posted a fourth-place finish and 13-7 league record in 2019, its best finish in three years. The Bruins made their 36th all-time appearance in the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the second round with a win over the ACC's Notre Dame before falling to host and fourth-seeded Wisconsin. UCLA has won the NCAA title four times, the last time coming in 2011.

USC IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT ... USC continued its NCAA Tournament streak, earning its 29th in a row after finishing sixth in the Pac-12 with an 11-9 record. The Trojans defeated Southland Champion Stephen F. Austin, one of only two 30-match winners in the bracket, in the first round but the season ended with a straight-set loss to No. 1 overall seed Baylor. The Trojans were making their 37th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance, winning the title in 2002 and 2003. The 2003 squad was the last undefeated Pac-12 Champion, also going a perfect 35-0 that year.

UTAH IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT ... For the fourth year in a row, Utah opened its tournament action in its home state, traveling to Provo for the second-straight year and third time in four years (Utah was host in 2017). Under the direction of 30th-year head coach Beth Launiere, Utah entered the tournament after posting its best-ever Pac-12 finish, coming in third place. The Utes made their 16th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance and fourth-straight. After being down 2-1, Utah battled back to defeat Illinois in five sets to get out of the first round. The Utes then handed No. 14-seeded BYU its first 3-0 home loss since 2011 to get to the regional semifinal for the second time in three years and fourth time in program history.

WASHINGTON IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT ... Placing second in the Pac-12, eighth-seeded Washington made its 18th-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and 24th overall, advancing to the regional final for the 15th time and first time since 2016. The Huskies have won at least 20 matches every year since 2002 and have finished in the top two in the Conference for the sixth time in seven years. UW advanced to the national semifinal in 2013 and last year reached the regional semifinal. Washington is 51-22 (.699) all-time in the tournament, advancing to the national semifinal four times and winning the crown in 2005. The Huskies posted back-to-back 3-0 wins to advance to the regional semifinals for the second-straight year and seventh time in eight seasons. They won a hard-fought 3-1 match over No. 9-seed Kentucky before falling to the No. 1 overall seed Baylor, 3-1.

WASHINGTON STATE IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT ... Washington State (23-10, 12-8) made its fourth-straight NCAA Tournament appearance and 14th all-time. The Cougs placed fifth in the Pac-12, sweeping the regular-season series against rival Washington for the first time since the 2001 season. WSU fell in the first round to San Diego in a hard-fought 3-1 loss.

CONFERENCE NOTES

• **STANFORD CLAIMS 19TH PAC-12 CROWN ...** For the third year in a row and 19th time overall, Stanford claims the Pac-12 crown. The Cardinal went 18-2 in league play, clinching at least a share of the title in the second-to-last week of conference play before winning outright on Nov. 26. The Cardinal were the overwhelming preseason favorite to win the Pac-12 title and has only finished lower than second three times in the history of the program, and never lower than fourth.

• **AVCA POLL NOTES ...** With the final regular-season poll released, STANFORD leads five Pac-12 teams in the AVCA Coaches poll, coming in at No. 3 in the nation with 10 first-place votes. WASHINGTON enters the postseason at No. 9 this week, followed by No. 17 UTAH, No. 23 WASHINGTON STATE and No. 24 UCLA. CALIFORNIA and USC received votes.

At least five teams have been ranked in the AVCA poll every week this season with 10 different schools earning at top-25 ranking at some point during the season. Stanford was the overwhelming No. 1 pick in the AVCA Preseason Coaches poll released on Aug. 13. The defending NCAA Champion garnered 62 of a possible 64 first-place votes. It was the second-straight year the Cardinal were No. 1 in the preseason and the 74th all-time No. 1 ranking for the program.

Since 2003, the Pac-12 has had at least five teams in the preseason poll with the exception of 2014 and 2007 when four teams were ranked.

• **21 FROM PAC-12 EARN REGIONAL HONORS ...** A combined 21 Pac-12 women's volleyball student-athletes were selected to the AVCA Pacific North and Pacific South teams. Washington's Kara Bajema was selected the Pacific North Player of the Year while Washington State's Magda Jehlarova was picked the same region's freshman of the year. Utah's Beth Launiere was named the AVCA Pacific South Coach of the Year with fellow Ute, Danni Drews, named the region's player of the year.

• **NCAA & PAC-12 CAREER LEADERS ...** Stanford's **Jenna Gray** was the first active player in the NCAA to hit the 5,000-career assists milestone this season. The 14th player in Pac-12 history and the fourth Cardinal to record 5,000 career assists, she has broken into the Pac-12's all-time top 10, ranking ninth with 5,405. USC's **Khalia Lanier** became the eighth player in league history with 2,000 kills. She ends her career second among the NCAA's active leaders in the category with 2,025. Despite missing five weeks of action, two-time AVCA National Player of the Year Stanford's **Kathryn Plummer** became the 16th player in league history to record 1,900 career kills and is 10th, just behind all-time Stanford great Logan Thom (1,939).

Stanford's **Morgan Hentz** is fourth all-time in Pac-12 history in career digs with 2,270, breaking the all-time Stanford mark. Washington State's **Alexis Dirige** cracked the top 10 in the Pac-12 record books, ranking fifth all-time with 2,152. She became just the 14th player in league history to reach over 2,000 digs and ranks seventh all-time in the Pac-12 record book.

Stanford's **Audriana Fitzmorris** recorded her 600th block 12th all-time in league history to hit the mark. One of three active in the NCAA to have recorded 600-career blocks, she ranks behind USC's **Jasmine Gross**, who has tallied 647 in her career, over 300 of those coming in her two years at Pepperdine, is second on the NCAA's active career leaders list.

• **AROUND THE LEAGUE ...** After missing all of October and five weeks in total due to injury, Stanford's two-time National and Pac-12 Player of the Year Kathryn Plummer returned to the court on Nov. 7 at Arizona State, then put up 15 kills on 22 swings at Arizona two days later. Plummer missed matches from Oct. 4-Nov. 3, before returning. During her absence, the Cardinal still went 9-1 and took control of first place in the Pac-12. She was named NCAA Stanford Regional Most Outstanding Player ... Arizona's Julia Patterson became the first Power 5 Conference player to record a triple-double this season in a hard-fought five-set loss at No. 17 Utah. The senior setter had 46 assists, 13 digs and a career-most 10 kills in the match. The triple-double was the first in her career and the first by a Wildcat in at least 10 years ... Arizona State's 17-13 overall record and nine Pac-12 wins surpass its totals from a year ago when it went 16-12 overall and 8-10. Both are the most wins since 2015, the last time the Sun Devils advanced to the NCAA Tournament ... California eclipsed its overall wins and league wins from a year ago when it went 15-16 and 7-13 in the Pac-12. The Bears posted their first 20-win campaign since 2011. Its 10 league wins are the most since 2013 ... After starting Pac-12 play with an 0-10 record, Colorado closed out the season going 5-5 in the month of November, posting wins over UCLA and California, while also taking Washington State to five sets ... Oregon ended the season going 2-1 in its final matches. It posted a 3-6 record in five-set matches, but one of those wins was against Utah on Sept. 29 and USC on Nov. 24. The win over the Trojans was the third five-setter in a row for the Ducks ... After starting league play at 2-0 for the first time since 2004, Oregon State ended the season with three victories, which was better than the 1-19 record it posted in 2018 ... Stanford's first loss of the season came after the Cardinal put together a school-record 37-match win streak, which dated back to Sept. 1, 2018 and included a 6-0 run in last season's NCAA Tournament to claim the national championship. Its second loss of the season to Washington on Sept. 29 snapped a 26-match winning streak against Pac-12 teams ... After missing out on the NCAA Tournament last season and posting its first-ever losing campaign in program history, UCLA has made a big turnaround, recording more overall wins than last season (13 in 2018) and more league wins (11 in 2018). The Bruins posted a winning record this season, tying for fourth in the Pac-12 after finishing ninth last season ... Sophomore Raquel Lázaro is the only Trojan to have played every set this season and leads the Pac-12 in double-doubles (20) ... Utah's pair of top-25 wins to open the season is the first time it had beaten two AVCA ranked teams in the opening weekend in program history, with wins over then-No. 7 Kentucky (3-0) and then-No. 23 Cal Poly (3-2). It also beat Saint Mary's (3-0) in the true season opener for the season's first match. The Utes posted their fifth 20-win season in seven years. Their 12 Pac-12 wins are a team record. They advanced to the regional semifinal for the second time in three years and the fourth time ever ... Washington posted its 18th-consecutive 20-win season, surpassing its Pac-12 win total from a year ago (20). The Huskies, who finished an uncharacteristic sixth in the league last year, finished second in the Pac-12 race after being picked to finish fourth ... Washington State produced significant milestones, recording its first sweep of USC since 1986 late in the season. Earlier this season, WSU's home sweep of the Oregon schools was the first time it had knocked off both teams since 2002 at Bohler Gym. It completed the regular-season sweep of both the Oregon teams, marking the first time WSU has accomplished that since 2002. WSU has posted back-to-back 20-win campaigns for the first time since 1996 and 1997. The Cougs posted back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time since 1995 and 1995.

ALL-PAC-12 HONORS

PLAYER OF THE YEAR -- MAC MAY, JR., OH, UCLA (Dubuque, Iowa.)

Mac May (Dubuque, Iowa) becomes the sixth Bruin and first since 1994 to win the Conference's top honor. She has led the Bruins back to the NCAA Tournament, and the team's 36th all-time, after missing out on the postseason last year. May ends the regular season as the league's second-leading scorer, averaging 5.53 points per set. Her 0.41 service aces per set leads the Pac-12 and her 4.84 kills average are second. Her kills and points per set averages also rank her 13th and ninth, respectively, in the country. May was tabbed the AVCA National Player of the Week on Oct. 29 after leading a then-unranked UCLA to wins over then-No. 2 Stanford and then-No. 15 California, and was twice named the Conference's Player of the Week. With May leading the way, No. 24 UCLA finished fourth in the Pac-12, its best finish in three years, going 18-11 overall. May is a sociology major.

FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR -- MAGDA JEHLÁROVÁ, MB, WASHINGTON STATE (Prerov, Czech Republic)

Magda Jehlárková is the first-ever Cougar to win the Pac-12's top rookie honor. In her first-collegiate season, she averaged 1.42 blocks per set, which ranks 10th in the country, while posting a Pac-12-best .366 hitting percentage. Her presence at the net makes WSU one of the top-30 blocking teams in the country, averaging 2.61 blocks per set. She was the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 15 following a week which saw the Cougs sweep the Oregon schools for the first time since 2002. Also voted to the All-Pac-12 team, she was named the Pac-12 Freshman of the Week on Nov. 4 after helping WSU to a regular-season sweep of USC, its first over the Trojans since 1986. Jehlárková helped No. 23 Washington State to a fifth-place Pac-12 finish with a 12-8 record and 23-9 overall, the program's second-straight 20-win campaign and third in four years. Jehlárková plans to study human services case management and administration (human development).

SETTER OF THE YEAR -- JENNA GRAY, SR, STANFORD (Shawnee, Kansas)

Senior Jenna Gray has put together another stellar campaign as she caps her collegiate career and leads defending national champion No. 3 Stanford into the postseason. Gray ranks ninth in the country and first in the Pac-12 in assists per set at 11.54 directing an offense that ranks in the top five in the country in hitting percentage (6th, .289), kills per set (5th, 14.71) and assists per set (3rd, 13.79). A two-time first team AVCA All-American, Gray became just the fourth player in Stanford history to surpass the 5,000-assists mark, ranking second all-time. The NCAA's active career leader in the category, her 5,245 assists also rank 11th in Pac-12 history. Gray is the second Cardinal to win the top setter honor three times in the nine-year history of the award after former Cardinal Madi Bugg won it from 2013-25. Gray is a human biology major.

LIBERO OF THE YEAR -- MORGAN HENTZ, SR, STANFORD (Lakeside Park, Ky.)

Senior Morgan Hentz is the second student-athlete in the nine-year history of the award to win Pac-12 Libero of the Year three times. Anchoring the backbone of the defending national champion No. 3 Stanford squad, she leads the Pac-12 with 4.96 digs per set, helping the Cardinal post the second-best opponent hitting percentage, limiting them to .176 hitting on the season. A two-time AVCA All-American Hentz was the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week three times this season, including the final two weeks of the season. Just the third player in school history and 14th in the Pac-12 to register 2,000-career digs, she broke the Stanford career digs record and ranks fourth all-time in Pac-12 history with 2,207. Hentz is a psychology major.

COACH OF THE YEAR -- BETH LAUNIERE, UTAH

Utah head coach Beth Launiere was voted the Pac-12 Coach of the Year for the first time in her career. In her 30th season at the Utah helm, it is the fourth coaching honor for Launiere, winning the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year award three times before Utah joined the Pac-12 in 2011. In 2019, the Utes have recorded their best-ever Pac-12 finish, coming in third place with a 14-6 record. The 14 Pac-12 wins are a team record. Utah is also a 22-9 going into the NCAA Tournament, the third 20-win season in four years for the team. Launiere has guided the No. 17 Utes to a fourth-straight NCAA Tournament appearance and sixth in seven years. She has a career record of 586-369 (.614), leading Utah to all 16 NCAA Tournament appearances.

• **WHO'S BACK ...** Eight AVCA All-Americans returned from last year, including two-time AVCA National Player of the Year and Pac-12 Player of the Year **Kathryn Plummer**. She is one of just three Cardinal to earn multiple national player of the year nods and the first in the Conference since 2001 and 2002 (Logan Tom). Also back are 2018 first-team All-Americans **Jenna Gray** and **Morgan Hentz** (STAN). Second-team All-Americans on the court in 2019 are **Brooke Botkin** (USC), **Dani Drews** (UTAH), **Audrianna Fitzmorris** (STAN) and **Ronika Stone** (ORE), as well as third-team All-American **Kara Bajema** (WASH). Eleven of the 14 players named to the 2018 All-Pac-12 team returned for 2019, now three-time Pac-12 Setter of the Year Gray and three-time Pac-12 Libero of the Year Hentz. An All-Pac-12 honoree the last two seasons, UCLA's Mac May was among the all-Conference honorees back in 2019.

• **NEW COACHES ...** The Pac-12 welcomed back California head coach Sam Crosson who came to Berkeley after turning around a Cal Poly squad that made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 2017 and 2018. Twice voted Big West Coach of the Year, he was an assistant coach on the 2010 team that made its only national championship match appearance in 2010. He has led the Golden Bears to their best start since 2011.

• **FAMILIAR FACES ...** The most tenured coach in the Pac-12 is Arizona's David Rubio who is in his 28th season and who's contract was extended through 2023. He is just the second coach in league history to have recorded 500-career wins. Head coach Beth Launiere is in her 30th season at the Utah helm, recently leading her team to three-straight NCAA Tournament appearances.

• **UP-AND-COMING ...** Pac-12 volleyball continues to attract marquee student-athletes, teams hauling in their share of top recruits. 2019 is no different with 12 VolleyballMag.com FAB 50 selections appearing on five league rosters, the second most of any conference, with Stanford signing the top class in the country.

• **HISTORICALLY SPEAKING ...** The Pac-12 has had 10 or more All-Americans selections in 11 of the last 15 years. Ten former Pac-12 players have earned All-America honors four times, while 22 players in all have earned All-American honors three times. Since 1990, Pac-12 players garnered AVCA Player of the Year honors 16 times, including the seven of the last nine years - California's Carli Lloyd (2010), USC's Alex Jupiter (2011), Oregon's Alaina Bergsma (2012), Washington's Krista Vansant (2013), USC's Samantha Bricio (2015) and Stanford's Kathryn Plummer (2017 and 2018). The NCAA Honda Sports Award honor has been bestowed upon a Pac-12 volleyball player 20 times, including Plummer in 2018.

STANFORD VOLLEYBALL VOTED PAC-12 PRESEASON FAVORITE AGAIN

SAN FRANCISCO - For the second-straight year, the 12 league women's volleyball coaches voted defending NCAA and Pac-12 Champion STANFORD the preseason favorite to win the regular season in 2019, the Conference office announced on Monday. The Cardinal received all 11 possible votes for 121 points to come out first in the polling for the sixth time in seven years. USC comes in second in the poll with 104 points, while OREGON is third with 99 points, receiving the only other first-place vote.

In addition to the annual coaches poll, the Pac-12 announced the Preseason All-Pac-12 team, as voted on by the league coaches. Ten of the 14 all-Conference honorees from a year ago appear on the 14-player preseason squad this year, including eight 2018 AVCA All-Americans and two-time AVCA National Player of the Year and Pac-12 Player of the Year Kathryn Plummer of Stanford.

Returning five letterwinners and its top libero from last season's national championship and 20-0 in league-play squad, the Cardinal are the heavy favorite to repeat as Pac-12 Champion. Head coach Kevin Hamby welcomes back four All-Americans, the two-time national player of the year and signed the top recruiting class in the nation.

USC has last year's top freshman in the Conference returning. 2018 Pac-12 Freshman of the Year sophomore Raquel Lazáro had the highest assist average in the nation among freshmen last season, leading the Trojans to the NCAA Tournament in head coach Brent Crouch's then-first season. The Ducks had its best finish since 2012, tying for second in 2018. They welcome back All-American Ronika Stone in 2019, as well as another top-10 recruiting class.

WASHINGTON had 98 points to place fourth in the standings. After the Huskies finished uncharacteristically out of the top two, which it had done for five-consecutive seasons from 2013-17. UW will look to senior All-American Kara Bajema to lead the team this season. UTAH collected 68 points for fifth place in the preseason poll. The Utes are coming off its best season since joining the Pac-12, finishing fourth with junior All-American Dani Drews as the go-to.

With 65 points, ARIZONA placed just ahead of UCLA (63 points) to rank sixth and seventh, respectively. The Wildcats look to make a second-straight trip, and sixth in seven years, to the NCAA Tournament. The Bruins missed out on the NCAA Tournament last season, but had key wins over five ranked opponents, barely missing out on the postseason.

Tied for eighth are CALIFORNIA and WASHINGTON STATE, tallying 45 points each. Cal is under the direction of a new head coach with Sam Crosson making a return to Berkeley after spending seven seasons turning around the Cal Poly program. WSU is coming off its most successful three-year stretch, making the NCAA Tournament each season during that span, including a trip to the regional semifinal last year.

COLORADO (44 points), ARIZONA STATE (23 points) and OREGON STATE (17 points) round out the polling in 10th, 11th and 12th place, respectively. The Buffs have eight letterwinners back from last season's NCAA Tournament team. ASU had three big wins over ranked league teams last year and has an experienced team back. The Beavers also return key contributors after dealing with several injuries last season.

PAC-12 IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Pac-12 has captured 16 out of 38 NCAA titles, including 14 of the last 28. With Stanford winning its eighth crown last year, and two of the last three, it is now the nation's leader in NCAA titles. Four different Pac-12 teams have claimed the NCAA titles and has had at least six tournament berths for 20-consecutive years. Pac-12 teams have compiled an impressive 483-256 (.654) record in NCAA play. Toss out the 20 postseason matches between Conference teams since 2001 and the league's NCAA Tournament record against non-conference foes stands at 263-105 (.715) during that span. Over the last 20 years, Pac-12 teams are 120-20 (.857) in the first round, including posting a NCAA-record 10-0 in 2015 after a NCAA-record 10 league teams earned bids that season.
