STANFORD HOSTS 2020 PAC-12 WRESTLING CHAMPIONSHIPS

PAC-12 WRESTLING CHAMPIONSHIPS PREVIEW

ARIZONA STATE

The Sun Devils have seven wrestlers nationally-ranked among the top 20 in the latest InterMat rankings. However, redshirt senior **Zahid Valencia**, three-time Pac-12 Champion and two-time NCAA Champion at 174, has been suspended indefinitely and his status for the Pac-12 Championships is to be determined. The All-American has posted a career record of 121-3. Four other Sun Devils have recorded 20 or more overall wins this season: **Brandon Courtney** (125, 23-5), defending Pac-12 Champion **Josh Shields** (165, 21-4), **Anthony Valencia** (174, 20-6), and **Tanner Hall** (HWT, 21-3). ASU ended the dual season 15-2 with seven top-25 wins and four top-15 wins. The win total is the most by a Sun Devil wrestling team since 1989-90, when the program finished with 18.

CAL POLY

The Mustangs are led by senior **Tom Lane** (197). Lane is 17-4 this season and currently ranked No. 12 nationally in his weight class. He's won eight of his last nine bouts with his only defeat coming to then-No. 16 Kordell Norfleet of Arizona State (Dec. 8-5). Redshirt freshmen **Bernie Truax** (165) has won seven of his last nine matches, with his only two losses coming against a pair of ranked conference foes - Stanford's Shane Griffith and Arizona State's Josh Shields.

CSU BAKERSFIELD

Senior **Russell Rohlfing** (149) is 21-7, 11-2 in dual meets, including a 4-0 mark in Pac-12 competition. Rohlfing has won his last nine consecutive bouts and has posted three straight 20-win seasons. With Arizona State's Zahid Valencia sidelined, redshirt sophomore **Josh Loomer** (184) looks to contend in the wide open weight class. Redshirt junior **Jarrod Snyder** (HWT) has won five of his last seven.

LITTLE ROCK

Junior **Paul Bianchi** (133) leads the Trojans during their first season of competition. He was a national qualifier at the 2018 NCAA Championships during his freshman season at North Dakota State. Bianchi was 2-1 in Pac-12 dual meets, with his only loss being a 8-6 decision to No. 10-ranked Devan Turner of Oregon State. Nineteen freshmen dot the Little Rock roster for its inaugural season.

OREGON STATE

OSU paces the Pac-12 with 23 league crowns. Redshirt junior **Devan Turner** (133), currently ranked No. 17 in the country, has won five straight and is 24-9 entering the Pac-12 Championships. Redshirt sophomore **Grant Willits** (141) is the defending Pac-12 champion at 141. Willits, who earned Pac-12 Wrestler of the Week (Jan. 29) following his 7-1 decision over No. 10 Josh Heil of Campbell, has won his last three and boasts a 21-8 record this season. Redshirt freshman **Brandon Kaylor** (125) is 17-5 this season, winning his last eight in a row.

STANFORD

After capturing its first-ever Pac-12 wrestling title, the defending champion Cardinal look to make it two in a row on its home mat. Stanford is led by a couple of nationally-ranked redshirt freshmen in **Real Woods** (141) and **Shane Griffith** (165). Woods is nationally-ranked at No. 3, and is 17-1 this season. Griffith, also ranked at No. 3, has an unblemished mark of 26-0 this season, which is the second longest winning streak in program history. Defending Pac-12 Champion redshirt junior **Nathan Traxler** (197), nationally-ranked at No. 11, is 19-4 this season and will face a talented field at the 197 weight class.

2019 PAC-12 CHAMPIONSHIPS RECAP/YEAR-IN-REVIEW

After competing for the Conference wrestling title since 1963, the STANFORD Cardinal finally earned its first-ever Pac-12 crown, edging host ARIZONA STATE by two points. It was the closest team competition since Oregon State edged Boise State by two points in 2010. The Cardinal posted 81.5 points behind two individual Pac-12 Champions – **Requir Van Der Merwe** (149) and **Nathan Traxler** (197). ASU picked up 79.5 points behind individual titles from **Christian Pagdilao** (157), **Josh Shields** (165) and **Zahid Valencia** (174), while OREGON STATE finished third just two points behind the Sun Devils with 77.5 points. The Beavers had four individual winners: **Ronnie Bresser** (125), **Grant Willits** (141), **Bob Coleman** (184) and **Amar Dhesi** (285). CSU Bakersfield, behind **Sean Nickell'**s (133) second Conference title, finished fourth with 49.5 points. CAL POLY was fifth with 15.0 points. Valencia was named the Most Outstanding Wrestler of the Championships after he posted a pair of wins, both by technical falls.

Valencia becomes the third all-time to be named Pac-12 Wrestler of the Year three times. The junior successfully defended his NCAA title at 174 pounds to finish the year with a 31-2 record. The three-time All-American became the seventh Pac-12 wrestler to post back-to-back NCAA titles. He was recipient of The Hammer award presented by *Amateur Wrestling News*. The award is presented to the wrestler who wins the national title at what the writers at *AWN* decide is the most competitive weight class. OSU's Wilits was named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year after capturing the Pac-12 title at 141 pounds and qualifitied for the NCAA Championships. He finished with a 18-9 record. Stanford's **Jason Borrelli** was named Pac-12 Coach of the Year by his peers after leading the Cardinal to its first-ever Pac-12 title. Along the way, the Cardinal defeated three ranked opponents during the season and sent five wrestlers to the NCAA Championships.
